All are now in awe of the wonderful recycling effort undertaken and facilities at "Caloundra Dump", and the relaxing pleasantness that can be experienced at Corbould Park Racetrack.

The next bus trip, the sixth, is programmed for Tuesday 19th October 2010.

Lunch is likely to be at Gowinta Farms before return home to Maleny.

Cost will be as on previous trips - \$5 bus fare, about \$10-\$15 for lunch, and at some time a \$1 raffle to help defray costs.

Bus pick-up/departure times - Erowal 9:20am, RSL Hall Maleny 9:30am, and any enroute pick-up to be determined/sorted. However, all are encouraged to "car-pool" to/from RSL Hall for 9:30am departure and 2:15pm return to the Maleny R.S.L.

Coral Street round-about work proceeding!

Work on the Coral Street, Maleny round-about is proceeding at a steady pace. This work is part of the Maleny Maple Street project area extends from Myrtle Street to the Obi Obi Creek Bridge and includes a variety of community spaces.

This project has been in planning since 2005 and follows community consultation as to how Maple Street, Maleny should look and feel at the end of the project. That consultation showed that Maleny people wanted "a feel" that retained the artistic, rural, historical, cooperative and organic nature of Maleny township.

The project commenced in May 2010 with the removal of trees from Apex Park to make way for construction of the roundabout then power pole relocations, water main upgrades and drainage.

It is now anticipated that the civil construction on the project site will be finished by mid-Novem-



ber 2010 and that will be followed by the restoration of Tesch Park.

Construction work had been slowed because of problems with replacing some water pipes by Unity Water. Those pipes had to be realigned before the roadworks could continue, however that work is now complete and work can now continue unabated.

This particular roadwork will result in the loss of a further three car parks from Maple Street.

The garden is walking distance to the popular tourist destination of Montville, and is a colourful old fashioned garden around a century old Queensland house. This is a complex collectors garden full of traditional hardy ornamental plants.

The garden is wheelchair compatible and there is street parking available.

The garden has a rambling design with large trees, meandering pathways and many interesting garden spaces. It is a collectors garden, not an exhibition garden.

Over the last Queens Birthday long weekend this garden along with 5 others was open for "Gardening on the Edge" otherwise known as the

"Arts and Gardens Festival".

Mum's favourite Recipes

Another Aussie meat pie

- One of my favourites!

Ingredients

- * 750g minced steak, * 2 beef stock cubes, * 1tsp soy sauce,
- * 1 1/2 cups water, * pinch nutmeg, * 2tbsp plain flour,
- * salt and pepper, * 1/4 cup water (extra)

Pie base

- * 2 cups plain flour * 2/3 cup water * 1/2tsp salt * 1 tbsp beef dripping.

Pie top

- * packet puff pastry, * 1 egg yolk, * 1tsp water

Method

Place meat in a saucepan, stir over low heat until meat is well browned, drain surplus fat, add crumbled stock cubes, water, salt and pepper, nutmeg.

Stir until boiling, reduce heat, cover and simmer gently for 20 minutes, remove from heat.

Combine extra water and flour, stir till smooth, add the flour mixture to the meat, stir till combined, return to heat, stir till meat boils and thickens, add soy sauce, mix thoroughly. simmer uncovered for 5-10 minutes, remove from heat and allow to cool.

To make the base

Sift the flour and salt together in a bowl.

Place water and dripping in a saucepan, stir till dripping melts, remove from heat.

Make a well in the centre of dry ingredients, add the liquid, stir till combined. Turn out on a lightly floured board, knead lightly. Roll out pastry to line 8 greased pie tins (around the same size tin as a pot pie comes in) cut off excess pastry from the sides of the tins, fill the base with cold meat filling.

Pie crust (top)

Make up puff pastry (according to directions on packet), roll out on a lightly floured board, cut into rounds for top of pies (use a saucer as a guide for size) wet edges of base pastry and gently press tops into place, trim edges with a sharp knife. Brush tops with combined egg yolk and water.

Bake in a hot oven for 5 minutes until golden brown, reduce heat to moderate and bake a further 10 minutes.

Serve with tomato sauce on top.

If you know the person mentioned please have a quiet word to them.

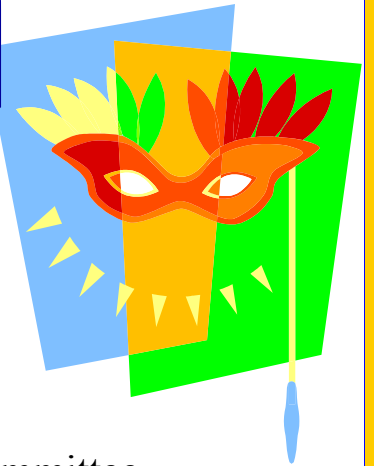


This week's award goes to:-

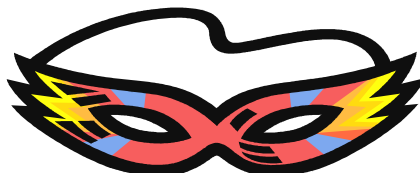

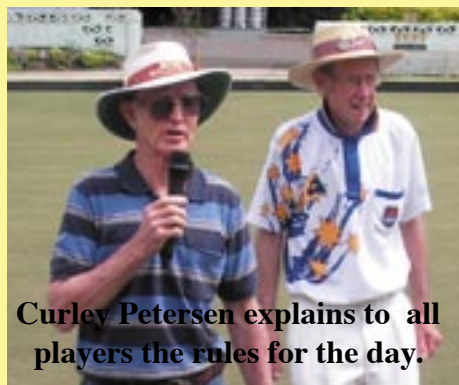

Slipper ...the new Deputy Speaker of Federal Parliament

Local Federal Member of Parliament for Fischer, Peter Slipper has been elected as the Deputy Speaker of the forty-third parliament of Australia.

This comes after being at the centre of a dispute after his name was put forward earlier in the week.

This would give a benefit to the Federal Labour Government as it would be one vote less that they would have to find when a vote is crucial.

Mr Slipper denied doing a deal with Labor and it still remains uncertain if Mr Slipper would absent himself from votes.

This is an important question that remains to be seen as the Federal Labour Government now has only a one vote majority in the house.

Mr. Slipper has been under pressure recently over his spending practises with respect to travel expenses and printing.

It has been suggested that this should be the last time that Mr. Slipper be backed by the Liberal National Party as the local member as new blood is needed.

Woman lucky to escape serious injury in traffic accident

It was a lucky escape for the female driver of a car who escaped major injuries when the car that she was driving left Balmoral Road, Montville at Gerraty's Lookout at about 10.30a.m. on Tuesday September 28th, 2010.

The car continued about 250 metres down a steep hillside after crashing through a wire fence trapping the driver in the vehicle.

Luckily a family was enjoying the view from Gerraty's Lookout when they heard the noise of the car bouncing down the steep incline.

A member of that family immediately contacted Emergency Services and as a result firefighters and paramedics were soon on the scene and made their way to the bottom of the cliff to reach the woman.

Paramedics treated the woman for back pain then emergency crews used a stretcher to carry her back to the Balmoral road.

She was then transported her to Nambour Hospital in a stable condition.

Local towtruck operator, Ross Hopper said, "she was certainly lucky that there were some people stopped at the lookout at the time as the car ended up in a spot where she would not have been seen by passing traffic."

He continued that she could have remained trapped in her car without anyone knowing that she had been involved in an accident at that place.

Police are continuing inquiries into the cause of this incident.

Weeds and animal pests concern council

The Sunshine Coast Regional Council is concerned about the damage to the environment by weeds and animal pests and the degradation of the natural ecosystems and agricultural land caused by these pests.

A draft Pest Management Plan covering the Sunshine Coast Local Government Area will be available for public comment as from Saturday 18 September until 4pm on Monday 18 October 2010.

Submissions from individuals and community groups will be accepted until 4pm on Monday 18 October 2010.

A council spokesperson said, "We need everyone on board if we are to manage weed and pest animal populations throughout the Sunshine Coast."

What to look for before painting your home!

Identification of Exterior Paint Surface Conditions and Recommended Treatments

It is assumed that a preliminary check will already have been made to determine, first, that the painted exterior surfaces are indeed wood--and not stucco, metal, or other wood substitutes--and second, that the wood has not decayed so that repainting would be superfluous.

For example, if any area of bare wood such as window sills has been exposed for a long period of time to standing water, wood rot is a strong possibility. Repair or replacement of deteriorated wood should take place before repainting. After these two basic issues have been resolved, the surface condition identification process may commence.

Older buildings will undoubtedly exhibit a variety of exterior paint surface conditions. For example, paint on the wooden siding and doors may be adhering firmly; paint on the eaves peeling; and paint on the porch

balusters and window sills cracking and alligatoring.

The accurate identification of each paint problem is therefore the first step in planning an appropriate overall solution.

Paint surface conditions can be grouped according to their relative severity: CLASS I conditions include minor blemishes or dirt collection and generally require no paint removal;

CLASS II conditions include failure of the top layer or layers of paint and generally require limited paint removal; and

CLASS III conditions include substantial or multiple-layer failure and generally require total paint removal. It is precisely because conditions will vary at different points on the building that a careful inspection is critical.

Each item of painted exterior woodwork (i.e., siding, doors, windows, eaves, shutters, and decorative elements) should be examined early in the planning phase and surface conditions noted.

Telco Inquiry

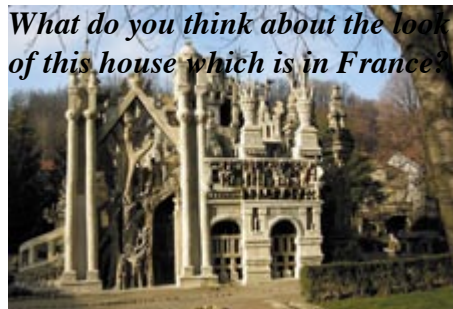
The Australian Communication and Media Authority is hosting an inquiry into telco customer care.
