Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

Q: I need to paint my wooden front door, which is currently stained. It also has scratches at the bottom from a dog. How do I fill the scratches and prepare the door? -- Jim C. Witt.

A: The best way to proceed would be to take the door off its hinges and lay it flat over some sawhorses (you can also do this with the door still in place, but it's easier and results in a better finish if you can lay it down). Sand the door with 80- to 100-grit sandpaper to remove dirt, light scratches, and any clear finish that might be over the stain. Apply a paste-type exterior-rated wood filler over the deeper scratches using a putty knife, allow it to dry, then sand the filled areas. If necessary, repeat this operation.

Now lightly sand the entire door one more time using 120-grit paper. Remove all the dust with a vacuum or by blowing with compressed air, then apply one coat of New Look acrylic sealer primer undercoat, followed by one or two coats of New Look gloss exterior paint.

If the door had been painted previ-

ously with an oil based paint then use Newlook quick grip instead of the Newlook sealer primer undercoat.

If the color you have selected is dark, you can have the primer tinted to a darker shade so that it's easier to cover with the finish paint.

All the materials you need - including the wood filler, primer, paint, sandpaper and brushes - are available from Maleny Paint Place, 12 Bunya Street, Maleny.

Watoto (Swahili for children)

Whilst we, as a community this week will be working to raise money to assist the Watoto Children's Choir we should think a little about what this event is really about.

Since 1986, over 30,000 boys and girls have been abducted in Northern Uganda and forced to become soldiers, laborers and sex slaves. These children are taken by the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA), a rebel group that has waged war against the Ugandan government for nearly two decades.

Whilst optimism about prospects for peace in northern Uganda is growing the country is still in the grip of the continuing civil war between the rebel Lord's Resistance Army and the Ugandan Government.

Making peace is no simple task. The population is traumatized by continuing violence, and HIV/AIDS rates in the conflict areas are almost double the national average.

Forced into sexual relationships, many girls become pregnant and give birth in the bush, with only other young girls to assist them. Events that are seen as everyday occurrences in Northern Uganda would leave all Australians bewildered. To make things worse for these children those born in captivity as a result of rape by one or several LRA soldiers are often seen as unacceptable outsiders.

Male children are regularly abducted. The children who survive deliberate killing and disease are brutalized, are forced to serve the LRA army as conscripts and sex slaves, and are forced to commit crimes themselves. For children who are abducted, captivity can last for years.

For those who do survive at home the lack of any water is a big problem, more of a problem than food. Villagers need to wake up around four in the morning and go out to search for water, sometimes returning home at mid-day and that is

just for that day's water.

Some children became so thirsty they drink their own urine for relief. Other times, are unable to urinate because their thirst is so great and their bodies so dehydrated.

For most abductees, release or escape does not end their ordeal.

To make things worse corruption in Uganda is widespread. Within 9 years of National Resistance Movement's reign, public corporations which are the backbone of Uganda's monetary economy, have been bankrupted by Museveni's appointees. This means that the country has no real means to provide for the people of Uganda.

Coupled with this there is little hope that peace will come to the country in the near future.

Any future that Uganda and its people have must come from outside the country and it is the more financial nations that will have to carry the biggest burden if this country is once again to be a safe place to live for its residents.

So when we see these talented children and the joy they bring we must show them that there is hope. What we can do as individuals may appear to be very little when combined means a lot.



Mum's favourite Recipes

Bar B. Q. Burgers - great for a Sunday lunch

Ingredients - 1kg minced beef - 1 small onion, chopped finely - 2 cloves garlic, chopped - 2 tblsp barbecue sauce - 2 tblsp Worcestershire sauce - 2 tblsp fresh parsley, chopped - 1/2 cup breadcrumbs - 1 egg, lightly beaten - 1 large onion, sliced - 6 slices cheese - 2 tomatoes, sliced - 6 bread rolls - 1/2 lettuce

Method - Put beef, small chopped onion, garlic, sauces, parsley, breadcrumbs and egg into large bowl and Mix until combined.

Shape mixture into 6 burger patties.

Cook burger patties on barbecue until browned on both sides, cook large sliced onion as well. Add sliced cheese to the top of burgers for 2 minutes or until melted.

Split and toast rolls, then add lettuce and tomato, burger patties with cheese and onion.


