Free holiday buses to return

- * Flexilink services (Boreen Point to Tewantin, Conondale to Witta to Maleny, Kenilworth to Mapleton and Peachester to Beerwah)
- * Council Cabs.

The programme has long been completed and the daily programme can be downloaded from the Woodford Festival web site. That includes the children's programme and the artisan's programme.



Mum's favourite Recipes Peppered T-Bone Steak



Ingredients

- * 1 cup chopped onion
- * 1/2 of a 12-ounce can (3/4 cup) beer
- * 1/4 cup parsley
- * 2 teaspoons brown sugar
- * 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- * 3 beef T-bone steaks, cut 1 inch thick (about 1 pound each)
- * 1 to 1-1/2 teaspoons cracked black pepper
- * 1 Tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- * 3/4 cup chili sauce
- * 3 Tablespoons Dijon-style mustard
- * 1/2 teaspoon paprika

Directions

In a large glass baking dish combine onion, beer, chili sauce, parsley, mustard, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, paprika, and the 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Place steaks in marinade. Cover and refrigerate 4 to 6 hours or overnight, turning steaks over occasionally.

Remove steaks from marinade; discard marinade. Sprinkle both sides of steaks with the cracked black pepper.

Grill steaks on an uncovered grill directly over medium-hot coals for 5 minutes. Turn and grill to desired doneness, allowing 7 to 10 minutes more for medium (160 degrees F) doneness.

Shoes and Socks for disadvantaged kids

Between Monday the 21st and Wednesday the 23rd of November, 52 schools in the Sunshine Coast area including Landsborough, Peachester, Beerwah Maleny and Conondale areas will be receiving the first of their two shipments of shoes and socks for disadvantaged children.

The second shipment will be delivered approximately 2 days later making a total of 1,322 pair of shoes and socks in total delivered.

The new shoes and socks which will be delivered free by Star Track Express. The donation was made by the Brighter Future 4 Kids Foundation's (BF4KF), which is a new children's charity that has launched a program called 'Shoes & Socks 4 Kids'.

The program provides free leather BATA shoes and 3 pairs of Underworks socks to children in need who are going to school with no shoes, or worn out shoes with holes, or held together with staples or sticky tape.

Pauline Preston, BF4KF Managing Director said; "We are delighted to be able to help kids go to school so they can take advantage of their best opportunity to break the cycle of poverty – their education.

The donation was made possible thanks to the support of philanthropic grants, local businesses and individuals, and Star Track Express who are so generously delivering all the shoes and socks for free!

Thanks to their support we will have successfully delivered shoes and socks to almost 3,000 Queensland kids in need so far."

The Shoes & Socks 4 Kids program is a result of more than year's re-

search by the charity, which spoke to schools and teachers to find out what the most important and urgent needs of disadvantaged children were.

"What we learned shocked us. Teachers see first hand the consequences of poverty because primary children spend up to 200 days a year in their classroom.

Schools told us that it is great to have so many organisations offering free literacy and mentoring programs, but when children are coming to school miserable because they have no shoes, or cold wet feet because their shoes have holes, these programs are at best not achieving their potential."

"And for many of these vulnerable children, the worn out shoes they do have are typically the only shoes they own – even if they are just thongs." Pauline added.

The charity's waiting list has grown to more than 200 schools requesting help for more than 5,000 children in just a few months.

"The need is urgent. We have schools sending us photos of children with sores on their feet because they have no shoes, or posting us shoes that are so worn out they are only held together by the back seam."

"For children arriving at school sick or wet or not arriving at all due to holes in their shoes - the challenges of learning can become overwhelming. They find it extremely hard to concentrate and retain information and often have more medical problems.

They can also become the subject of cruel teasing and taunts and are more likely to perform badly on

reading, math and other tests simply due to not being comfortable and able to learn properly."

It costs just \$29.95 to give one child a decent pair of school shoes and three pairs of socks delivered to their school. A luxury some families are struggling to, or cannot afford.

The Brighter Future 4 Kids Foundation is 100 per cent volunteer run, which means they have no staff salary costs, so 100 per cent of their efforts go to helping kids in need.

The charity hopes to find a major corporate sponsor that can help them expand the program so they can assist children throughout Queensland and Australia.

Each year lives are lost as a result of people underestimating the power of flowing flood waters over road and overestimating their ability to drive through that water. QFS figures reveal that firefighters rescue more people from people trapped in vehicles in flooded water than they do from fires.

Because it is impossible to see what dangers are hiding under the water they can be treacherous.

Rather than getting caught by rising flood waters take the time before starting your journey take the time to check road conditions.

There is just no excuse for those who deliberately drive past a road closed sign into flood water.

Local naturalist Grant talks nature

Red-bellied black snake - "Pseudechis Porphyriacus"

Long termed Maleny resident, Grant Myer loves photographing insects, animals and native flowers.

Over the coming issues he will bring us some photos of some of the natural scenes that he has witnessed along with an explanation of the circumstances surrounding the photo.

The story is often as interesting, if not more than the photo.

"One Saturday whilst working just outside of Maleny township I was about to have some lunch.

I was sitting on the banks of a dam which had water plants on the surface. I noticed what I first thought was a stick and thought to myself, "that wasn't there at smoko."

The stick started to move towards me. At first I thought that I was seeing things. When I realised that it was in fact moving across the water lillies I grabbed my camera from my knapsack and took some photos of

it on the waterlillies.

I realised that it was a red-bellied black snake which has the scientific name of *pseudechis porphyriacus*. This snake is a species of elapid snake and is native to eastern Australia. It is one of Australia's best-known snakes.


This particular snake itself was no more than 30 cms in length.

Whilst this species of snake is venomous it is not as venomous as some other Australian snakes.

I watched as the snake slid from the lilly into the water and then onto the bank of the dam where it slithered into the grass.

I just remained still as it came quite close by me. It was so calm and just passed me by.

Even though this snake was a baby it does pack just as much of a bite as does the adult versions so just enjoy their beauty from a distance.

Between 1p.m. and 2.30p.m. on Wednesday December the 7th you can find out an effective ways to lose weight, feel great and get more energy.


It all starts with walking and using what mum's already have at their disposal, a pram. It is a fantastic way for mum's to start on a health kick.

Cullen in Irish is O Cullinor 'holly tree'. The Cullens were once a numerous clan in Wicklow until driven away by the O Byrnes and O Tooles. They moved to Company Kildare and there many have remained giving their name to the town of Kikullen. They were also recorded in the later 16th century in Wexford as being gentry of Cullenstown. The name has an astonishing number of variations including Cullion, Culhoun, Mac Cullan and Cullinane. They were remarkable for the ir powerful clergymen, particularly bishops. There were a number of Cullen castles and mansions in the midlands including the ruined Liscarton Castle, once home of relatives of Ireland's first cardinal, Cardinal Paul Cullen.

Prepare your home for storms!



It has been suggested by the Bureau of Meteorology that the 2011 - 2012 summer season has a 60 - 75% chance of not only having above average rainfall but damaging storms.

Now is a great time to prepare your home and surrounds so that you are best able to survive those storms.

Some of the things that should be checked as part of a general home preparations before storms are imminent.

Ensure your home, contents and car insurance is current and covers your assets adequately – check your policy includes debris clean up and disposal;

- 1 Identify which room is the strongest part of the house, in case you need to shelter in your home during severe storm or cyclone. Usually this would be the smallest room in the house, with the least windows;
- 2 Identify where and how to turn off the mains supply for water, power and gas;
- 3 Purchase emergency essentials to have on hand, such as:
 - containers to store drinking water supplies,
 - spare supply of fuel for use in your vehicle (ensure you store safely),
 - wide masking tape for windows, and
 - hessian bags and sand for sandbagging indoor drains to prevent sewerage backwash from flooding.

Don't leave it until the storm is blowing outside before you prepare your home. To contact the SES for flood and storm assistance ring 132500.

The Musings of an old codger!

Once again our dairy farmers are being asked to take further price cuts on the price of raw milk at the farm gate.

This is not the first price cut that they have been required to take since the price war on milk between Woolworths and Coles commenced.

In the short term this might appear great for the consumer, but is it. Before considering the price cut presently operating firstly think about the quality of the milk in those special priced products. It is certainly not of the quality that consumers have been used to in the past.

In the short term prices might remain lower. Don't be mistaken - the battle is about market share and squeezing any opposition to those two larger distributors out of the market so prices can once again be lifted to much higher levels.

Local milk suppliers such as Maleny Dairies and other independent bottlers of the product are the only people who can in the longer term keep prices at reasonable prices for a quality product.

Whilst supporting those independent local suppliers may be a bit more costly in the short term it will pay off in the longer term, and the quality and service is much higher.

Don't fall for the three card trick and think that you are getting a bargain with cheaper Coles and Woolworths milk - support your local dairy farmers and suppliers.

Need to seal a damp area? Shalex Sealit Multipurpose!

Shalex Sealit Multipurpose is a water based general purpose waterproofing compound designed for use on a wide variety of substrates or surfaces.

Sealit Multipurpose is especially suited to sealing and protecting porous vertical masonry surfaces such as split faced or decorative concrete blocks.

Sealit Multipurpose dries to a clear low sheen finish and remains flexible to accommodate minor movement in the substrate. Sealit can be over painted with any acrylic paint. Due to exceptional adhesion Sealit is well suited as a primer for acrylic architectural topcoats, elastomerics and roofing paints. Sealit is not designed as a final coating for trafficable areas and should be over coated with a harder coating such as Shalex Glaze.

PREPARATION

This Step Must Be Followed Dilute 1 part Sealit with 1 part clean water. Apply liberally, flooding the surface working from top to bottom on vertical surfaces.

While still damp work back over

original surface area to ensure area is fully coated. Do not return unused compound to pail.

APPLICATION

Sealit Multipurpose is designed as a penetrative sealer. To ensure sufficient product is applied to the surface we recommend application with a backpack style low pressure sprayer (eg pesticide sprayer) as this allows a constant stream of Sealit to be applied at a consistent rate across the substrate.

Wet on wet application during priming is vital to ensure sufficient coverage and penetration. Brush or rollers may be used for smaller areas (eg window sills, etc) but users should ensure liberal application with frequent brush or roller re-loading. Mask all areas not intended for waterproofing well prior to application.

Apply evenly to ensure a complete film covers the surface. Backrolling is advised to keep product in contact with the substrate for as long as possible.

Ageing employees

The ratio of working age Australians and those aged over 65 is decreasing from 5:1 today to an expected 2.9:1 by 2050, warned Age Discrimination Commissioner Susan Ryan.

The Commissioner noted that while older age is often regarded as a negative point for employers, it fails to recognise that older people are very often enthusiastic about working, are capable, skilled and knowledgeable, but have been forced into retirement or have become a burden on the public purse at a time when there is a nationwide skills shortage.

The Commissioner made the comments at the Australian Industry Group Personnel and Industrial Relations Conference.
