Shoes can be left at any Sunshine Coast Regional Library so it is easy to drop them into the Maleny or Beerwah library from where they will be collected and transported to Brisbane where a container is awaiting them for transport to Zambia.

#### Local business finding times are tough

Australia Zoo administration spokesperson has announced that there will be a reduction of approximately 26 jobs at the Zoo.

This is in response to increasingly difficult times being faced by the operation due to the present economic conditions.

The spokesperson continued "Australia Zoo has taken all measures to retain members of the Australia Zoo team, however regretfully the difficult decision has been made to temporarily downscale less than 5% of the team across the business – which equates to 20 fulltime and six casual staff - and push back expansion plans in the

interim."

Inquiries of a number of local operators of acommodation houses reveals that local tourist bookings, especially for mid-week accommodation have been dropping for some time, however the Easter bookings are continuing to be strong.

This all compounds with visitor numbers dropping as the flowon effect to other businesses also drops.

# Mum's favourite Recipes Split Pea and Bacon Soup make 2 or 3 lots at a time &

#### **Ingredients**

- \* Large onion diced \* 2 medium diced potatoes \* 3 bay leaves
- \* One tablespoon lemon juice \* 1 cup fresh peas
- \* 1 teaspoon dried thyme \* 10-14ozs split Peas
- \* 1 diced stalk of celery \* 2 handfuls bacon bones

#### Method

Place bacon bones, dried peas, onion, celery, bay leaves and thyme in a large saucepan, cover with water. Bring to the boil, place cover on and simmer for 50 minutes till peas are cooked.

Remove bay leaves and bacon bones, skim off any excess fats and add the potatoes and simmer till tender. Then add the fresh peas and continue cooking until peas are hot. Serve hot.

### Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

What tools are necessary to complete that painting job around home?

"Use the right tool for the job" is an old tradesman's saying and it is certainly true of painting.

If you are going to do your painting yourself it's worth spending a little to get the basic tools that will help you do the job properly.

They will pay for themselves when you think of the money you are saving!

#### Rollers

There is a range of roller covers available and choosing the right one for the job will help you get better results.

#### Ladders

A good step ladder is a must. Aluminium ladders are lightest and the easiest to move around, but they are usually the most expensive.

Steel and wooden ladders will do the job. A flat or clip on tray will help hold tools and paint cans, giving you an extra hand to hold on with. An extra ladder and a trestle plank is a luxury that will save you many trips up and down the ladder.

#### **Drop Sheets**

Light canvas or calico sheets are the easiest to work with and will last the longest.

Light plastic sheets are inexpensive and should be used only for covering furniture. They are slippery, do not absorb paint, allowing it to be walked away on the soles of shoes, and may be dissolved by some chemical strippers.

#### Rags

A good supply of rags will help you clean up as you go. For water based paints keep a damp rag handy, for oil based paints moisten your rag with turps.

#### **Paint Pots**

These can be bought, or you can make one. An old 4 litre paint can works well, especially if you take out the rim with a good can opener (tap down any sharp edges with a hammer). A paint pot will allow you to carry a smaller, lighter quantity around. And if an accident does happen you'll spill a lot less!

#### **Scrapers and Knives**

A quick look around your hard-

ware store will show you a huge range of scrapers.

Listed below are a basic selection.

Putty Knife: You'll need one to make filling cracks and small holes easier.

Stripping Knife: A wide bladed knife for stripping paintwork, wallpaper etc. It can also help with filling wider holes and depressions.

Narrow Scraper: Will help you get into corners and confined spaces.

**Shave Hook:** A triangular scraper blade in a handle, available with either straight or curved blades. Good for curved mouldings and energetic stripping.

If you're doing exterior work you will also need a brass wire brush and/or a stiff bristle brush.
