## Cystic Fibrosis passes through Maleny

Just like Lily Korst in last weeks newsletter, 34 year old Rick Faulks suffers from cystic fibrosis.

Cystic fibrosis (CF) is the most common life threatening genetic condition in Australia - and there is no cure. CF is a degenerative condition that affects many of the body's systems, including the lungs and digestion.

As we saw with Lily, children diagnosed with CF live

through daily physiotherapy and medications, among other treatments, just to survive.

Less than 7% of the funding for research and treatment comes from government, so the financial support of donors is vital to continue this research and treatment.

Most children diagnosed with CF will live to an average age of only 38 years.

To raise peoples knowledge about the disease and a little money for research on the side he started a 1900 kilometer bike ride on July 27th from Cairns and he arrived in his home town of Ipswich on August 29th.

On August 25th he passed through Maleny, camping at the Maleny Showgrounds for the night before setting off early the following morning headed towards Caboolture.

Accompanying him as support crew on this

bike ride are his parents, his parents in law, wife and 4year old twins Griffin and Bella.

## From hinterland to coast to sing

**E**very Wednesday evening, enthusiastic singers from many parts of the Sunshine Coast and Hinterland gather in North Buderim to sing, as members of the Sunshine Coast Choral Society.

From Mooloolo, Caloundra, Noosa, Mapleton and many areas in between they make the effort, no matter what the weather, to join others of like mind to sing the great choral music, mainly oratorio, in four-part harmony under the direction of a highly experienced professional conductor.

Typical are the group from the Mapleton area who car pool, taking turns in the driving. They include Roger Pilcher, Christine Gallagher and Katherine Butler from Kureelipa, and Kaye Butler from Highworth. All are active in their local community, and Roger (a retired Finance Executive), Christine, (owner of the Mapleton Book Store) and Kaye (an English as a second Language teacher) also sing in and serve on the Committee of the Mapleton Choir, of which Roger is Secretary. Katherine is a retired nurse.

When asked why they make the effort to come so far, they all answered similarly. Roger summed it up by saying: 'I am involved with SCCS mainly for the major works and the challenge of singing complex music with a skilled and enthusiastic music director and with other talented singers....'

Currently the Choral Society is rehearsing *Petite Messe Solennelle* by Rossini, a Mass neither little nor solemn. Of it Roger commented '...it certainly is some of the most challenging music that I have participated in, and I think it is stretching all of us. It is providing a wonderful experience'. The others all agreed '....we love it – the rhythm and the melody, almost jolly at times...' 'It's just

such beautiful music, especially the piano accompaniment. Exciting really' added Christine.

As in the first performance conducted by Rossini himself in 1864, the singers will be accompanied by an unusual combination of three keyboards - two pianos and a harmonium.

The accompanists will all be accomplished local musicians - Natasha Koch and Janet Brewer on piano, and Neil Booth on harmonium. Soloists will be talented and experienced young opera singers from Brisbane - Jennifer Turnbull, soprano; Georgia Hawes, contralto; David Kidd, tenor; and Sam Elliot, bass. Conductor will be the choir's Music Director Adrian King.

The concert will be at Lake Kawana Community Centre Bokarina, at 7pm on Saturday 12 September.

Tickets are now on sale and can be obtained from Jennifer over the counter at Northwind Apartments, Mooloolaba, or booked by telephone on 5444 3899.

Tickets will also be available at the door.

Prices are \$28, Concession \$23, Students \$15.

## Mum's favourite Recipes

### Casserole Pork Chops

- great tasting & a filling meal.

#### Ingredients

- \* 3/4 kilo pork chops
- \* 250m apples
- \* 1 oz flour
- \* 1/4 litres water
- \* 1 onion
- \* 1oz dripping
- \* Salt and Pepper

#### Method

Peel, core and slice apples and put them into a casserole. Mix a little salt and pepper with the flour and roll the chops in this.

Fry the onion (peeled and sliced) in the dripping and when done, add to the apples in the casserole. Fry the chops till lightly browned on both sides, and place them over the onion. Add the remainder of the flour to the dripping in the pan.

Blend well and add the water. Bring to the boil and pour over the chops. Put the lid on the casserole and bake in a moderate oven for about 2 to 3 hours.

## The "NUT" Award


It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules.

## Girl Guides coin

A special commemorative coin marking the 100th anniversary of the Girl Guides movement will be released in September 2010.

Approximately 30 million \$1 coins

will be minted in 2010, with about five million to be the Girl Guide coins. It will be the 15th commemorative circulating \$1 piece since the dollar coin was introduced in 1984.

## Grocery Prices

Additional information known as "Unit Pricing" is now becoming more common on price tickets at your local supermarket.

This involves including information on price tickets on the price per unit of the item (for example, per 100 grams) so that similar food items that are packaged differently can be compared more easily on the basis of price.

Unit Pricing laws came into effect on 1 July and prices must be displayed by 1 December 2009 by all retailers who sell food-based items, have floor space greater than 1000 square metres, and sell the minimum range of food based items.
