Waste Levy to start December 1st

As from 1 December businesses will pay from \$35 per tonne extra when depositing landfill waste at council facilities. Anyone with a commercial general waste bin service will notice the extra charge in their rates notice. Recycling does not attract the levy.

Lower-hazard regulated wastes, such as treated timber and food processing waste, will attract a \$50 per tonne levy. The levy also will be adjusted according to the Consumer Price Index rate each year.

The aim of the levy is to help reduce waste generation in the first place, encourage more recycling and resource recovery. This levy will help fund new programs and initiatives to help businesses implement new waste management and recovery practices.

This is a State Government levy and will be implemented by local governments throughout Queensland. This levy is being implemented as part of the State Government's Waste Reduction and Recycling Strategy 2010-2020.

Tourist stuck on Mt. Beerwah

A female German tourist in her early 20's spent a cold night on Mt. Beerwah after becoming stuck during an afternoon walk with a male accomplice on Monday October 31st. The male person was able to make it back down to safety before dark and raised the alarm.

An S.E.S. Mountain Rescue group climbed the mountain at night, however were unable to safely get to the location of the missing person. After approximately 6 hours this group returned down the mountain to return at first light.

When the search resumed at first light the stuck woman was rescued by the crew of the AGL rescue helicopter.

When safely back on the ground the German tourist said, "First thing - to have a shower would be good."

To make this climb the stuck people had to walk past signs indicating that the tracks were closed because of dangerous conditions. The track has been closed for some time as rubble fell making the track dangerous to climbers. The tracks are very steep and are described as challenging and should be attempted by experienced climbers only.



There is a \$300 fine for disregarding those signs. The cost of the rescues would total in the vicinity of \$25,000 - \$30,000. Some members of the local SES Group believe that the fine should be raised to better represent the proper cost of the rescue.

Rescues in the Glasshouse Mountains are regular tasks for members of the Glasshouse SES Group, the previous one being only weeks ago. Mt. Beerwah is not a mountain that you should try to climb without good fitness. It's not a mountain you would want to do without good fitness and preferably in the daylight hours. Climbing should be commenced in the early hours of daylight as the return trip takes about 6 to 7 hours.

Luckily, in this case the stuck person had some warm clothes and a small amount of food. Contact was maintained with the trapped person via mobile phone. It was a cold night to be stuck on the mountainside. She suffered no injuries as a result of her night outdoors.

Mum's favourite Recipes Potato & Onion Frittata

Ingredients

- * 4 brown onions, thickly sliced
- * 1 tbs thyme leaves
- * 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1.5 tbs brown sugar
- * 40g butter
- * 1 tbs balsamic vinegar
- * 2 tbs extra virgin olive oil
- * 3 (about 500g) desiree potatoes, thinly sliced
- * 6 free-range eggs, lightly whisked
- * Thyme sprigs, to serve
- * 1/2 cup (125ml) thickened cream

Directions

Heat the butter in a large frying pan over medium heat until foaming. Add the onion and garlic and reduce heat to medium-low. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes or until onion is very soft and beginning to caramelize. Add the sugar, vinegar and thyme and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until sugar dissolves and mixture thickens. Remove from heat. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer to a bowl.

Add half the oil to the pan and place over medium-high heat. Add half the potato and cook, turning occasionally, for 5 minutes or until lightly golden and tender. Transfer to a plate. Repeat with remaining potato.

Preheat the grill on high. Heat the remaining oil in a small (15cm base measurement) frying pan over medium heat. Layer the potato and half the onion in the pan. Whisk the egg and cream together in a medium bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Pour over the potato mixture. Reduce heat to low. Cook for 5 minutes or until the frittata is golden and set underneath. Remove from heat and place under the grill. Cook for 3-4 minutes or until golden brown and just set. Remove from heat and set aside for 5 minutes. Turn onto a clean work surface.

Cut the frittata into wedges. Serve warm or at room temperature with remaining caramelised onions and thyme sprigs.

The "NUT" Award

It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules. Sometimes this is because they are not aware that road rules change from time to time.

One of our readers suggested that we should have a quick refresher of some of those rules.

The most dangerous thing about travelling in a motor vehicle is still the "NUT BEHIND THE WHEEL".



What are the new fog light rules?

Fog lights must be turned off in clear weather, day or night. Drive with fog lights on in clear weather and you risk being fined \$40.

Question: How do I identify fog lights on my vehicle?

Fog lights are usually placed just below the headlights on the front of a vehicle, that is, in the front bumper. Rear fog lights are usually positioned in the existing tail lights or below the tail lights, that is, in the rear bumper. Fog lights must be able to switch on or off separately from other lights on the vehicle.

Hinterland Heritage Assured

On Friday, Sunshine Coast Council and the Friends of Pattermore House signed a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the elegant historic centrepiece to Maleny's developing Community Precinct. This provides real certainty for its future as a prominent example of hinterland heritage.

The document formalises the path forward in continuing the work to preserve and conserve the 1907 State heritage-listed building and its extensive grounds.

Divisional councillor Jenny McKay oversaw the signing of the agreement, saying "It has been a privilege to be involved with this project over the last three-and-a-half years. The people who have contributed to the work have been amazing".

Friends of Pattermore House president Susan Carbery acknowledged Council support for her group's work had been wonderful.

"Council has supported our ideas, helping us work to preserve and conserve, and through this MOU we can see the future now," she said.

"I would also like to pay homage to Emily Pattermore (nee English), who was the first person to push for Pattermore House to be heritage-listed, back in 2003."

Unitywater announces profit

Unitywater, Moreton Bay Council and the Sunshine Coast Regional Council shared \$68.6 million dollars profit after the first year of trading. Sunshine Coast Council received \$18.8 million dollars. Total revenue for the year was \$474 million.

This was despite an exceptional season with rainfall and other extreme weather conditions.

CEO Jon Black said, "Unitywater spent about \$160 million on projects to improve water supply and infrastructure. Unitywater had worked hard to ensure a high water and sewage treatment standards. Customers pay a lot of money and expect this."

There is still about \$450 million worth of improvements to be completed.

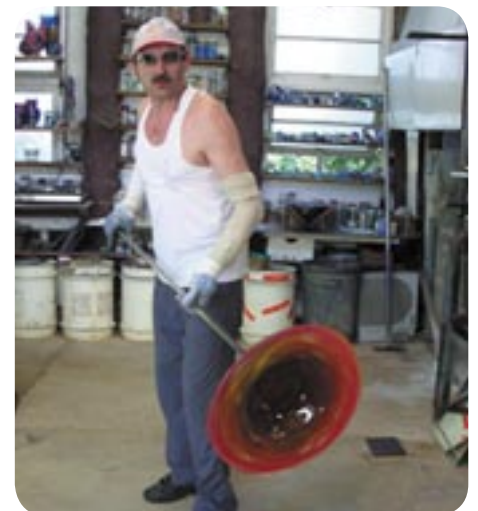
Mark Kalifa to design Australia Day Awards

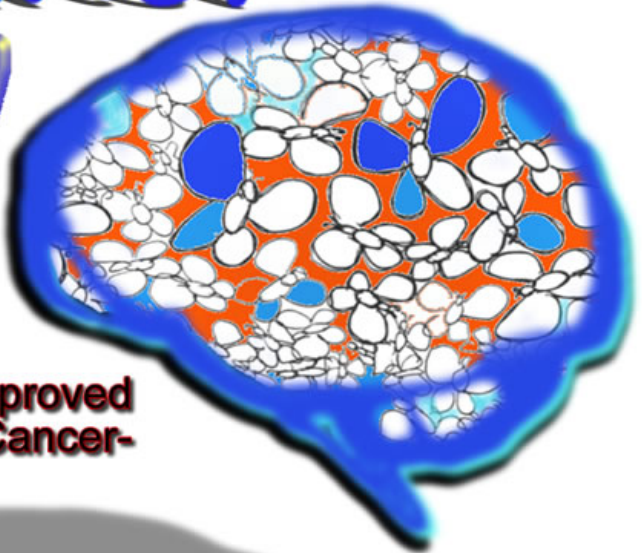

Missing Horse rider found safe

In what started off as a routine horse rider for a 26 year old Kenilworth woman on Wednesday October 26th ended in a full scale search when she failed to return home.

Police were advised about 8p.m. that night that the woman and her horse had failed to return from their regular horse ride on property at Booloumba Creek west of Kenilworth.

Fears were raised on the woman's behalf as the area in which she was missing is in close proximity to the area where two other women went missing in the late 1990's.

A British woman, 28 year old Celena Bridge went missing in July 1998 and local woman, Sabrina Glassop went missing in May 1999. Neither have been seen again and it is believed that these women were murdered.

Police are still making inquiries into the disappearance of these two women.

The area is isolated and contains a large forestry plantation. A search on the night of October 26th failed to locate the woman and the search recommenced on the morning of October 27th. The search involved police and SES volunteers along with trail bike riders and the AGL rescue helicopter.

There was a huge sigh of relief when the woman was located about midday on October 27th. The woman was safe and well. She had become lost as daylight was lost on the Wednesday afternoon.

Shadow Minister for Sport talks about the Maleny Precinct

The Shadow Minister for Local Government and Sport, Mr. David Gibson attended a meeting at the Maleny Bowls Club of people with interests in the Maleny Precinct on Thursday November 3rd.

The public meeting of about was well attended with about 70 people from many sporting and recreation groups that have the Maleny area as their base.

A number of those who attended addressed the meeting and all had the same message - there is a shortage of proper sporting facilities throughout the area.

Mr. Gibson explained that the Queensland Budget is in a poor state and there will not be a bit pot of gold. It is expected that there will be less than \$80 million dollars available and whatever is available will have to be shared throughout the state.

He continued that it was imperative to have a proper well researched plan with certainty of what facilities are needed with some certainty and a timeline of what facilities are needed and at what point of the project that they are expected to be provided.

He said, "As he sees it in the short

to medium term there will be "winners and losers" - the biggest hurdle that will need to be overcome will be a need to ensure that there will be no infighting over whose project is to be completed early in the process."



Ms Kerry Hindle, Head of Department for Sport at the Maleny High School gave a detailed account of the problems faced at the school ensuring that all students can avail themselves of the various sports played at the school.

She sees the Precinct Sporting facilities being heavily used by schools in the Maleny area.

Cr. Jenny McKay, Divisional Councillor for Sunshine Coast regional Council said that the council would do their duty in providing facilities at the Precinct, but the State Government must also play a part.

Mr. Gibson replied to this that he did not see the State Government as being the project banker - it is important for the community organisations to do their bit and not sit back and await for it just to happen.

Maleny Primary School Centenary Celebration

The Maleny State School P&C will be holding a meeting for the Maleny Schools Centenary Committee on Tuesday 8th Nov. at 5 o'clock in the new meeting hall at the Primary School.
