## What is new at the Ebenezer School?

What's the latest news from Ebenezer Trust School in Livingstone?

Because we have some of the most hard-working teachers, all 18 students from Grade 7 passed their secondary school entry exams with flying colours. Less than a quarter of Zambian school children progress to secondary school from primary, so this represents an outstanding achievement.

Our own school at Ebenezer does not go beyond grade 7 so these students have to go to Government secondary schools in Livingstone, which charge fees.

When our children sat for their exams we had no idea who would pay their fees. But God in His faithfulness took care of that. A group of people came from the UK and they fundraised for our students so that today all of them are in Secondary Schools.

Ebenezer Child Care Trust now has a total of 44 students in Secondary schools and 3 students in Tertiary education.

Together with the students in our own school, this makes a total of 347 students whose education is

funded by Ebenezer.

Thanks to all your wonderful support for us, these children will one day have a good future.

Now you oo can help these young people to obtain a better education which will result in a beter life-style.

The Maleny Friends of Ebenezer is holding a Family Bush Dance which will feature Mamma Syb and the Bush Rats.

## Sick of waiting in the queue on the council phone line?

How often have you wished to speak to someone at council to get an answer to a query but have given up in the long wait? Callers to Sunshine Coast Council no longer need to pick up a telephone, thanks to leading-edge technology introduced this week.

Web Call Back is now live across the Coast, allowing callers to log an online call-back request whenever they want to ring Sunshine Coast Council for information or conduct business over the telephone.

Customers simply go to council's website and log their name, suburb and number before clicking on the "call me" button. A customer service officer then automatically telephones them to deal with their query.

You simply send a three-word message online, then get on with your day knowing that a customer service officer will return your call promptly. For after hours emergencies, callers should ring 5475 7272 or 1300 007272.

## Mum's favourite Recipes

### Smoked salmon pasta

- One of my favourites!



### Ingredients

- \* 220g farfalle pasta
- \* 2 tablespoons olive oil
- \* 1 fresh red chilli
- \* 3-4 tablespoon butter
- \* 2 medium onions, finely sliced
- \* 3 cloves garlic, finely sliced
- \* 100ml of vodka
- \* 1 tablespoon fresh thyme leaves, plus extra to garnish
- \* 150g smoked salmon, roughly sliced
- \* pale celery leaves to garnish

### Directions

Bring a saucepan of salted water to a boil. Place the farfalle in the boiling water and cook until it's al dente.

Drain and set aside.

In the meantime, put the olive oil and butter in a saucepan and heat gently. Add the onions, garlic, chilli and thyme. Saute until the onions are soft and translucent - about 15 mins should do it.

Turn up the heat and add the vodka to the onions. Allow the alcohol to burn off for a minute or two. Remove the saucepan from the heat, then add the salmon.

Add the pasta to the salmon sauce, along with the extra thyme leaves; stir well to coat the pasta with the sauce. Serve immediately, garnished with a scattering of celery leaves.

Eventually Paddy sticks his head around the door and sees Mick running from bus to bus looking very worried.


"What in all hell are you doing Mick, get a move on!" to which Mick replies "I can't find a number 7 anywhere Paddy"

## Our Green Hint



*Let there be light!*

*Rather than having to turn on lights in each room one way to save on electricity is to take advantage of ultra-efficient light emitting diodes (LEDs) to add a little safety and peace of mind to hallways, kid's bedrooms, bathrooms and other spaces.*

*This type of lighting is greener than standard incandescent, and even fluorescent, lightbulbs because they generate almost no waste heat.*

*As most of the electricity used is output as light they are electrically efficient. LEDs remain cool to the touch, so they don't add excess heat into living spaces, which means less cooling is needed.*

*They last for tens of thousands of hours, meaning they can go years before they need to be changed, thereby cutting down on landfill waste.*

*Many electrical companies now sell LED nightlights, which are competitively priced with standard nightlights, and can be found at most home improvement stores.*

*They annual cost of energy for lighting each year is greatly reduced by LED type lights and also results in much lower carbon emissions over traditional lighting.*

*With the cost of electricity rising each time we get an electricity account anything that reduces our dependence on wasteful electrical appliances can only be good.*

### Some hints about how to paint your home

Some tips to ponder about painting the exterior of your home but before you paint.

#### Your materials checklist

- \* Paint
- \* Primer or undercoat
- \* Paint roller - polyester - polyester 10mm nap (the depth of the fibre surface of the (roller) for water based paints
- \* Paint roller - mohair - mohair 7mm nap, for solvent based paints
- \* Paint roller tray
- \* Brush 50 - 63mm wide for trims
- \* Brush 100mm for broad areas
- \* Cutting-in brush for window frames
- \* Sugar soap - (for washing down surfaces)
- \* Exterior filler - (such as Selley's Exterior Spakfilla for cracks, holes, dips, gouges and imperfections in masonry, brick and cement)
- \* Flexible filler - (such as Poly Woodflex for wood)
- \* Flexible sealant -(such as Selley's No More Gaps)
- \* Masking tape - (for window glass)
- \* Drop cloths - (to protect floors, driveways and paths)
- \* Mineral turpentine and clean-up rags

#### Step 1: choose your paint

Exterior: Gloss Acrylic, Semi Gloss Acrylic and Low Sheen Acrylic. Acrylic paint with high covering power. For use on masonry, brick,

concrete, metal, render, fibre cement and suitably primed timber.

#### Timber finishes

Gloss and Low Sheen. Acrylic paint which is long lasting. Recommended for exterior timbers such as fences, outdoor furniture, decking and pergolas. No primer required for most situations. There is now also available a timber finish with water resistant capabilities.

#### Gloss enamel

High quality full gloss oil based enamel with excellent covering power. Recommended for suitably prepared interior and exterior timber, metal and masonry. Although it resists knocks and scratches it being used less and is being replaced by acrylic paints.

#### Step 2: how much paint?

For outside walls, multiply length by height to give you the area in square metres, then subtract door and window areas from the total.

To determine window and door areas, multiply their width by their height and divide by five. One litre of paint will cover approximately 14 sq m but allow an extra 20 per cent for rough or porous surfaces and an extra 10 per cent for weatherboard edges.

## Flying international flag

I'm an enthusiastic supporter of events that help our local economy and the International Rally of Queensland is no exception.

Using my Embassy contacts in Canberra, I managed to source flags representing the nine countries in the competition. The flags were raised at Rally Headquarters and during trophy presentations. I was proud to play a small but significant part in the event.

About 2000 drivers, co-drivers, team members, supporters, sponsors and media checked into Sunshine Coast accommodation for at least three days. Many also managed to fit in some sight-seeing. Organisers are yet to calculate exactly how much the rally poured into the economy but everyone agrees it was a sizeable amount.

## School Chaplaincy Programme

I have recently been inundated with phone calls and emails from locals who are worried about the future of the National School Chaplaincy Programme. It's been pleasing to offer them some comfort and reassurance.

A Liberal National Government has committed to continuing the current funding levels indefinitely. In contrast, Labor has given no guarantee that the programme will

survive beyond next year.

Since the Howard Government started the programme in 2007, more than 1900 schools have employed part-time chaplains. They have played an invaluable role in the school community, particularly helping young people who battle loneliness or bullying, or who have difficulties in their families. It will be shame and a disgrace if the programme ends.

## Doctor shortage

My recent doctor's appointment was more than a chance for a check-up. It was an opportunity for me to hear firsthand about the doctor shortage on the Sunshine Coast.

I spoke with Doctor Michael Tan at Caloundra Central Family Practice, which has been working with me to raise the issue in Canberra. Dr Tan told me the lack of general practitioners on the Sunshine Coast forces the ones who are here to work long hours to try to meet the demand. The shortage also means medical practices frequently have to turn away patients.

I have vowed to keep championing ways to attract more GPs. It forms part of my second election pledge, which is to continue my determined fight to improve health services on the Sunshine Coast.

Incidentally, Dr Tan gave me a clean bill of health!
