Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

Proper interior paint preparation of your walls and ceilings before painting will often encompass more work than the actual painting. Up to 75% of the work can be getting a surface ready for painting.

Wall preparation for painting is more than covering the floor. If you don't intend to do the preparation right then don't bother painting at all.

The amount of painting preparation needed depends on three factors; (1) If the surface is in relatively good condition and previously painted, (2) If it shows signs of severe wear and tear, or (3) If unpainted and needing many steps before the finish paint can be applied.

Many of the basic interior painting preparation steps are relevant to all situations, whether a room is in good shape or needing extensive repair.

Situation 1 Room in Good Condition and Previously Painted.

The easiest rooms to paint are in good condition needing only minor wall preparation for painting. Covering and pro-

tecting non-painted surfaces is always a good place to begin.

This includes moving the furniture away from the walls toward the center of the room. If possible, remove as much furniture from the room. The less obstacles the easier the room is to paint.

Repair can be pulling a few nails no longer needed for hanging pictures and filling small holes with light weight spackle. Minor cracks in the walls can be filled with the same spackle. Now is a good time to check the caulking around windows and where the trim meets the wall, this includes all of the base and casing. If the trim is painted recaulk with a good siliconized acrylic caulk or elastomeric caulk.

Minor stains on the surfaces needing paint should be washed with mild soap and water or primed with a stain blocking primer if they can't be removed by washing. Now the interior painting can start. Apply the same type of paint that is on the surface or choose a good interior primer that is compatible with the finish paint.

When accomplished correctly painting will add real value to your home, not just improving its resale value. Lower utility bills and an emotionally pleasing environment are possible when using the best painting ideas and techniques.

This followed a Telstra announcement about improved high speed broadband services for parts of the Sunshine Coast and Caboolture. This improvement will have a dramatic impact on internet speeds for some 93,000 local residences.

Telstra has announced it will activate high speed ADSL2+ at some 900 telephone exchanges across Australia. In total, it says it will benefit some 2.4million consumers across the country.

The new services came on line for Maleny, Montville and Flaxton last month.

The "NUT" Award


It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules.

Ingredients:- * 1 kg chicken pieces - * 1 packet french Onion Soup - * 1 can Apricot Nectar

Walkway plans released by council

A walkway joining Maleny township to Gardner's Falls have been released by Caloundra City Council. These plans have brought this project closer as a result of land donated to council by the Cloudland Developers. Cr Dick Newman said that removing the footbridge across Obi Creek at the rear of Woolworths building from the plans had removed one major obstacle in this project.

This walkway was first mooted some years ago by then Caloundra City Councillor, Winston Johnston who had plans for a walkway commencing at the Maleny Showgrounds following along the banks of Obi Creek. At the time he donated part of his land in Coral Street to allow for this walkway.

Obi Creek is an important environmental area as it is one of the few creeks in the area that runs continuously. It is the home to many water animals and birds including the famous "Obi platypus".

The final piece of land needed to finalise this plan is behind Riverside Shopping Centre and discussions are underway in respect to this last link.

Another problem associated with the Riverside Shopping Centre relates to the now closed vehicular laneway from the car park into Teak Street. Candidate Winston Johnston said, "From discussions I have already had I am sure that I can come up with a solution to this problem within a month if I am elected in the March 15th election."

There was an area where a Nigerian peacekeeping contingent was deployed for several months, and they were in the habit of encouraging very young Liberian girls from

that he witnessed during his journeys into third world countries.

the nearby displaced persons camp to visit and seducing them with rice and a little money.

The girls were nine or ten. Then a Ghanaian contingent established a camp nearby, who were more generous. They would give a whole can full of rice as compared to more paltry handful from the Nigerians. So the girls started fre-

quenting the Ghanaian camp more than the Nigerians.

One day dead little girls started appearing on the path from the displaced persons camp to the Ghanaian camp but not on the path to the Nigerians. The girls had been decapitated and their heads inserted inside their nine year old vaginas.

In the opinion of the investigating officer, this was a message to the girls from the Nigerians that it wouldn't be worth it to frequent the Ghanaians for the sake of a little extra rice.

And these were the peacekeepers.
