## Queensland Air Museum holds "open day"

The annual "Open Cockpit" day at the Queensland Air Museum, Caloundra has once again drawn a large crowd who were looking to find the romance of a bygone era of flight and the heritage of Australia's aviation industry.

The Queensland Air Museum is celebrating thirty-five years of activity. It is important to remember that there are still people alive today who saw the beginning of aviation in Australia, that is how new this industry really is. It is amazing how much progress has been made in the evolution of flight in the last eighty years.

The crowd was well up on the last couple of years. It



was suggested by a museum spokesperson that the weather this year was much more pleasant than the past couple of years.

In spite of the ages of those that attended it is always one favourite that draws the big crowds,



that is the aeroplane that has the reputation of turning the tide of WW11, the Spitfire. There are still a number of active members of the air museum who saw service during the dark days of the 1930's and early 1040's in Britain defending the commonwealth.

Whilst the day belonged to the aviation industry, members of the Blackall Range

Horseless Carriage club displayed some of their vintage vehicles.

Along with a myriad of air-



craft with important places in Australia's history there is a DC3 which was used by General McCarthur whilst he was

stationed in Australia co-ordinating the war in the Pacific following the United States of America entering the war as a result of the Japanese raid on Pearl Harbour.

Another popular aircraft was the Caribou. Long lines of people waited to enter this plane to see just how Australian troops flew into battle during the Vietnam war.

Each year the Museum finds something different to attract bigger crowds.

## A bit about Australian Shiraz

Shiraz is widely perceived as Australia's premier grape variety and although we have produced many excellent examples of wines made from other grapes, Shiraz is the one that has captured the imagination of wine lovers and experts the world over. The vast array of regions, soil types and Australian microclimates produces a broad range of expressions and styles.

The Barossa and McLaren Vale regions of South Australia are the most famous, possibly due to highly prized old vineyards producing intensely flavoured, rich and earthy wines. The Hunter Valley has a long history with Shiraz, while Victoria combines some proven historic regions like the Grampians with newer, rising stars like Heathcote. If Shiraz grapes are picked late, they will often shrivel, become raisin-like and produce concentrated, dried fruit flavours. The big flavours of Australian Shiraz are suited to American oak, although a recent trend has seen a move to French oak, particularly in cooler regions.

## Mum's favourite Recipes

### Beef Stroganoff

- always a great easy Sunday night meal!

### Ingredients

Coles Beef Stroganoff Recipe Base

500g chicken breast, thinly sliced

1 red onion, thinly sliced + 1 1/4 cups grated tasty cheese

1 red capsicum, thinly sliced

100g button mushrooms, thinly sliced

8 small or 2 x 30cm pizza bases (unsauced)

Lite sour cream and chopped parsley, to serve

### Method

Preheat oven to 230 degrees

Combine chicken with the "beef stroganoff" recipe mix. Stir to ensure all chicken is coated.

Put pizza bases onto oven trays. Top with sliced onion.

Add chicken, ensuring that it is distributed over the base evenly.

Top with sliced mushroom and capsicum, then sprinkle each with cheese.

Cook for 10-15 minutes until chicken is cooked and cheese melted.

Remove from oven, add a dollop of sour cream and parsley to serve.

## Former M.P. Neil Turner dies

Former Queensland Speaker of Parliament and local Maleny resident, Neil Turner died on Monday July 4th as a result of a stroke. Well known, Mr. Turner had lived in Maleny before shifting to Nambour.

He was The Member for Warrego from 1974 to 1986, firstly as a Country Party Member, then as a National Country Party member after the name change in 1975. He then went on to become The Member for Nicklin from 1989 to 1998.

During his term in parliament, Mr. Turner held the portfolios of Transport and Primary Industries under Sir Joh Bjelke-Petersen.

He also held the position of Speaker of the Legislative Assembly for one term.

He was always proud of his election win of Warrego in 1974 which saw him the first conservative representative since Federation.

Mr. Turner was 77 years of age.

## Harvey's 100 years of Maleny Tough times in a depression!

Throughout our lifetime there have from time to time been some tough economic times. During those times relief comes from some unexpected directions.

Maleny has always had a strong dairying industry and this has helped to offset some of those difficult times.

When the depression hit in the 1920's there were two Afghan families, named The Kaha family and the Singh Family living in Maleny.

These two families had 20 children between them.

It was common practice for local businesses such as the bakeries, Co-operative and the rest to run accounts for the farmers because the farmers were paid for their dairy products monthly.

As the depression hit the return to farmers for their dairy products dropped to almost nothing.

As a result those farmers were unable to pay the shop-

keepers for the goods that were already purchased.

Realising that if the shopkeepers went broke then nobody would be able to get

their everyday needs.

The farmers and the shopkeepers came to an agreement whereby the shopkeepers were paid for goods with cattle.

Myers and Hurst General Store was perhaps the biggest purchaser of dairy cows through this scheme.

The store-keepers acquired reasonably sized herds.

The Singh and Kaha families, realising that they could not

get work so they agreed to tend to the cattle on behalf of the new owners.

Some dairy products were sold to the butter factory by the two families whilst other of the products were used to feed the families of the two families along with the Myers and Hurst families.

This continued until after the depression came to an end thus the various retail businesses were able to survive during the economic downturn.

## Lost boy found safe and well!

Cambroon Forestry area at the Booloumba Creek Camping area between Conondale and Kenilworth became a search area after a boy aged 10 years went missing at about 5p.m. on Wednesday July 6th.

The boy, a state ward had been walking with his carer and a group of friends when he walked off the track and became lost.

He was not dressed or equipped for spending a cold night in the bush. Temperatures in the area during the night had dropped to below zero.

A search was commenced at dusk by Police, Police dog squad and volunteers from the Kenilworth and Maleny State Emergency Service groups conducted ground and aerial searches. This area is a well-known walking area for bush walkers.

The boy was found by an SES at about 12.30a.m. by SES members who found him on one of the walking tracks known as the upper or top track. He was safe and well, but cold and wet.

Maleny SES spokesperson advises that the Obi Obi Road between Mapleton and Kenilworth is again open after extensive work.

Cadets learn leadership skills, effective communication, seamanship and bushcraft whilst at the same time developing confidence, self discipline and pride.

Sailing Opportunity exists to progress through the ranks from Recruit to Seaman, through to Petty Officer by virtue of commitment, examinations, taking responsibility and assisting the unit to maintain a

positive and enjoyable environment for all.

TS Centaur parades each Wednesday evening (school holidays excepted) at the Unit Headquarters in the Maleny Showgrounds from 1730 to 2040, cost of \$3. Cadets sail frequently at Caloundra.
