Local disaster group formed

EDivision 5 local councillor, Jenny McKay said that a local disaster group had been formed to assist during major incidents or disasters.

The group held its first meeting in December in time for the storm season. During that meeting it was detailed that flooding following storms and bushfires were the

most common likely types of major incidents where damage is caused.

A followup meeting held in early February started to discuss these situations in more detail.

It was revealed that communications was most likely the biggest cause for concern of the group and as a result there is a planned upgrade for the communications network.

Following a detailed risk assessment about the area The Sunshine Coast Council has outlined detailed information about a number of disaster situations and this information can be found at;

Peter Slipper denies “drawing up the rules”

Local Federal Member for Fisher, Mr. Peter Slipper has denied that he helped in setting up the Protocol that was used by the federal Department of Finance as the reasoning why they are blocking the release of details from the inquiry into his expense claims.

This is despite claims by Mr Alex Somlyay, LNP Federal member for Fairfax that responsibility for developing the protocol would have fallen inside Mr Slipper's area of responsibility when it was introduced in 2004.

At that time Mr Slipper was parliamentary secretary to the Department of Finance. It was this Department that introduced the protocol.

It is fair to say that Mr. Slipper and

Mr. Somlyay who previously were both LNP federal members have not enjoyed cordial relations. Mr. Somlyay believes that his former colleague, Mr. Slipper has over a long period of time brought politics into disrepute in the eyes of the public.

Mr Slipper declared the recently concluded investigation had cleared him of any wrong doing with respect to ghis expenses claims.

Mr. Slipper was recently elected as Speaker of the Australian Parliament causing him to resign from the

LNP and become the Independent Member for Fisher.

This move gave the Federal Labor Government one extra vote.



The “NUT” Award

It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules. Sometimes this is because they are not aware that road rules change from time to time.

One of our readers suggested that we should have a quick refresher of some of those rules.

The most dangerous thing about travelling in a motor vehicle is still the “NUT BEHIND THE WHEEL”.



What is the new rule regarding slip lanes?

Fail to turn left from a slip lane and you risk being fined \$60 and 2 demerit points.

Question: **What if there is congested traffic in the slip lane?**

The only exception to the rule using a slip lane is if the slip lane is obstructed.

A typical obstruction would be a broken down vehicle that is blocking the road. In this situation, you may turn left at the main part of the intersection (that is, traffic lights). A queue of congested traffic is not considered an obstruction.

Local naturalist Grant talks nature

Laughing Kookaburra - "Dacelo Novaeguineae"

If ever there is a case of having a bad hair day, then this is it. This photo was taken recently during the last lot of rain we had and it clearly shows that continuous rain-fall can get under anyones skin; (or feathers).



When I first saw this kookaburra sitting atop the clothes line it had its face turned away and it looked as if it had received an electric shock.

When I lived out at Witta I was able to watch these birds up close and they are a friendly bird. Over the years I have taken some great shots of the kookaburra, including a young one sitting on a windmill at Montville. (See Photo right)

The pair out at Witta had a couple of young ones in late 2005 and it

was the first time that I had seen the young ones up close, let alone having them calling for food all day long..

They will nest in tree hollows where possible and once able to fly they will move from place to place. I have seen that they can co-exist with other bird species.

They eat insects, field mice, lizards, snakes and small birds. Believe it or not I feed the birds bread with seeds in it, but not a lot as I don't want to interfere with their diets. Sadly though many people feed the birds mince or raw meat and think that this is great, but honestly it is not.



I read a story in the Courier Mail going back 5 or 6 years how a couple travelling from up north to the Gold Coast when they struck a kookaburra and it got caught in the front grill of their car. Upon finding it they took it to a veterinarian.

The Vet found raw mince festering in its lower beak creating a deadly bacteria that would have eventually killed the bird.

These birds do not have a tongue to help swallow food. That is why you see them whack their prey and gulp it down in pieces; so if you think that you have been doing these birds a good turn feeding them raw meat then think again.

Perhaps you should start breeding your own lizards or mice to feed them.

It is nice to get close to nature in any way, but we are human and they are wildlive and they can look after themselves.

The most pleasing thing I find about the kookaburra though is waking up early in the morning and hearing a chorus of laughter from these great Australian birds. It is better than a clock or a radio any day, and of course we all know that a kookaburra sits in the "ole gum tree".

Yet we still build on flood plains

For the third year in a row Queensland residents have been faced with devastating floods.

Whilst we usually consider that floodplains are often areas along the course of a river and are areas that are subjected to flooding. They can exist along our inland rivers and streams as well as our coastal rivers and streams.

For three years in a row many people have felt the hostility of the Australian weather, but what have we learnt.

We still want to build on floodplains and take the risk that nothing is going to happen in our lifetime.

People have to realise that there are certain risks with building on floodplains and decide that they will either not build on them or build structures that are able to withstand the effects of inclement weather patterns.

Developers should also have to build into new developments facilities that would not only reduce the damage caused nature turns against us, but allows the community to manage, in partnership, the flood risk associated with Australia's floodplains on a sustainable basis for the benefit of both present and future generations.

Making an insurance claim year after year is not the answer - it does not help those affected to overcome the stress that they have been through as a result of flooding.

Before further flood plains are built on along the coast there has to be some serious ground rules implemented to help future generations.

This might sound like a strange message from a Rural Fire Brigade group, but with the continuing wet weather around this message is of utmost importance at the present time.

The message is "With the recent rains its important not to cross flooded rivers or roads. You put emergency services personal lives at risk as well as your own."

With many roads suffering from water overflowing them many motorists have been enticed to drive vehicles into flood waters so that they can continue on their journey.

This is a dangerous activity, and those who take the risk, irrespective of driving experience can be caught out because it is difficult to judge the strength of the flowing water, the depth of the water, the condition of the road surface under the water and the ability of the vehicle to handle the depth of water.

Once a vehicle is overcome by the water there is nothing the driver can do to overcome the problem.

At this point the vehicle and the passengers are at the mercy of the flowing water.

At best the passengers can make their way back to dry land, but most times they become trapped in the vehicle or are actually washed away.

Rescuers then are required to place themselves at risk to assist when there was no need for people to put themselves at risk in the first place.

Many early Parliamentary Speakers were beheaded when he advised the King of a Parliamentary Decision that was not popular with the King.


The House of Representatives is designed to be a near replica of the House of Commons in the United Kingdom.

acquired titles such as Earl of Barrymore and Viscount of Buttevant.

This Tipperary town got its name from the

French *boutez-en-avant* ('strike forward'), the rallying cry of the Barrys in their many battles.

The Zonta Club of the Blackall Range is once again celebrating 2101 International Women's Day with a dinner evening to be held on Thursday 8th March 2012 at Flaxton Gardens.

The theme for the International Women's Day celebration is “Everything is Possible” and our guest speakers 2 women refugees from the Karen and Chin communities their stories lead to you believe that “everything is possible”.

One of these women, Silver a member of the Karen community, has an amazing story. Her mother fled into the jungle with her when she was 3 days old, to hide from the soldiers.

This continued to happen throughout her childhood and she finally reached Australia through the Federal Government Humanitarian Program.

The Karen women and those from other ethnic minorities from Burma are still being raped, murdered, used as porters and slaves and tortured on a daily basis. Their life experiences & their stories & their move to Australia are exciting, scary, overwhelming and refreshing all at the same time.

The hurdles they experience in the resettlement process are huge e.g. language and cultural differences. Many often experience depression after the initial excitement has abated because it is too different and too difficult.

The Footsteps for Burma campaign is based in Brisbane and wants to

raise awareness about the many atrocities committed in Burma. When people hear for the first time about the ethnic cleansing that is routine in that country they are shocked and saddened.

There are half a million people living as internally displaced people in the jungles of Burma. There are 150,000 people in 9 refugee camps along the Thai-Burma border.

Pearce Memorial Park damaged

At least \$3000 damage has been caused to Landsborough's Pearce Memorial Park playing field when the driver of a vehicle went on a rampage at the sports ground on the night of February 3rd, 2012.

Pearce Park which is on the Maleny side of Landsborough has been the site of many local sporting events, but on this occasion the activity was not authorised.

Those responsible removed safety bollards and then drove through a fence before "donutting" over a large part of the immaculately turfed field causing serious damage to a large part of the playing area.

To leave the playing area they drove through another part of the picket fence that surrounds the playing field.

Cricket matches in the local competition have had to be re-located as the field is damaged to the extent that games cannot be played there whilst it is in the present condition.

Volunteers have now to work hard to repair the surface so that authorised sporting events can continue.

The area is open to view to those travelling on Landsborough Road to or from Maleny at the time that the incident was happening.



Cost of living increases concerns locals

A recent survey conducted in South East Queensland reveals that the biggest concern for residents is the continually rising cost of living.

One of the major rising costs mentioned is the cost of energy, especially electricity. This cost alone has risen over 60% since 2007 and this is causing an ever increasing number of people having their power disconnected because of non-payment of their electricity account.

The cost of power will certainly rise again after July 1st when not only the carbon tax will be introduced, but an expected introduction of "smart meters" and a time tariff will be introduced. This will be "sold" as a program allowing power users to save money, however it would be most unlikely that people would be able to live with the conditions placed on the savings.

Anyone who has recently received their house insurance renewal will also notice a hefty increase in price.

The price of reticulated water and local government rates have also added to the rising cost of living.

This belt tightening is having an adverse effect on many local businesses.

Highway upgrade on Slipper's mind

The Member for Fisher and Speaker, Mr. Peter Slipper, armed with a petition bearing over 3000 signatures will meet with Minister for Main Roads, Fisheries and Marine Infrastructure Craig Wallace.

The meeting will take place in Brisbane on February 10th and will concern the proposed upgrade to the Bruce Highway from four to six lanes between Caloundra Road and the Sunshine Motorway.

The upgrade will also include closing the existing on-ramp and off-ramp from Sippy Downs Drive. This is just one of five access ramps that are proposed to be closed.

Following the closure of these access ramps the area would be serviced by a service road.

Local residents believe that the impact of this plan may have dire consequences for the University's plans to continue to grow. It will also have an adverse effect on businesses such as Aussie World which will be more difficult for passing traffic to access.

This means that Maleny people who shop in that shopping precinct will be faced with a more difficult access to that shopping area.
