Ken Hinds Collection grows!

Local collector and philanthropist, Ken Hinds has just added more to his huge collection of art and antique toys.

Ken is now one of the biggest individual collectors in Australia of art and collectables with his collection now numbering in excess of 30,000 items which includes over 5000 Australian works of art.

His art collection contains pieces by prominent artists with names such as Boyd, Whiteley, Hart and a growing list of other members of Australia's Art Royalty including Maleny's own Peter Hudson.

The collection also holds numbers of international artefacts from Pacific Island countries.

His toy collection is a snapshot of generations of children's fun with toys dating back nearly 200 years.

Ken is also the patron of the Caloundra Art Gallery which

was previously part of the Caloundra City Council Arts Division.

Ken is also deeply interested in Aboriginal art and has previously sponsored Australia wide displays of this art.

Sunshine Coast Mayor, Cr Bob Abbott once described the collection as a national, as much as a local treasure. He continued, "It's a collection of art like no other in a sense that it's almost an historical pageant of some of our major Australian artists."

The Sunshine Coast University in conjunction with the Sunshine Coast Regional Council will be displaying a special edition of Ken's Collection called "Across Australia" at the University of the Sunshine Coast Gallery, Sippy Downs between November 25th and December 17th. Gallery hours are Monday to Saturday between 10a.m. and 4p.m.

This will also be a perfect opportunity to speak directly with some of the F.O.E.A. team who visited Ebenezer last year.

They can give firsthand accounts of how money raised in Maleny is being used to support the orphaned and desperately disadvantaged kids who are in no position whatsoever to help themselves. Support is also given to elderly folk!

The orphanage has a continuing number of babies coming into the centre to be cared for.

This does not include the numbers of Congolese refugee children rescued directly from the Livingstone Prison by Mrs. Ranji Chara the Livingstone Director of the Ebenezer Orphanage.

Without the support of the people of Maleny the children at the orphanage would have no future, but because of Maleny they not only have a future but a reasonable life.

Feeling a bit ticky!

One of the by products of the wetter than usual period that we have been having in South East Queensland is the increased number of ticks that are presently being found around our area.

Ticks normally live all along Ausralias eastern seaboard and can be found all year around. At the present time they are in plague numbers.

Ticks suck the animals blood & injects a neurotoxin into animals.

A spokesperson for Maleny Veterinary Clinic said that they were having a busy tick season at present.

Some of the symptoms can be limb weakness, starting in the hind legs, progressing to the front legs, appearing wobbly & uncoordinated, falling over, paralysis and incontinence.

It is important to keep a daily check on all your pets.

Mum's favourite Recipes Mignonettes of Beef

- Queenslanders love good beef!

Ingredients

- * 4 pieces fillet steak
- * 3 oz (100 g) butter or substitute
- * 1 clove garlic
- * 1/4 teaspoon rosemary
- * 2 tablespoons brandy
- * 1/2 teaspoon french mustard
- * 2 tablespoons cream
- * 1 tablespoon chopped parsley.

Directions

Season steaks with pepper. Heat 1 oz (30 g) of butter in pan, add steaks, cook quickly on both sides until cooked as desired - rare medium or well done. Remove steaks from pan, keep warm; drain off butter from pan.

Heat remaining butter in pan, add crushed garlic, rosemary, brandy, mustard, cream, and parsley (rest of ingredients!). Simmer gently until sauce is reduced by half; season with salt and pepper.

Return steaks to pan, turn once to coat with sauce. Serve immediately.

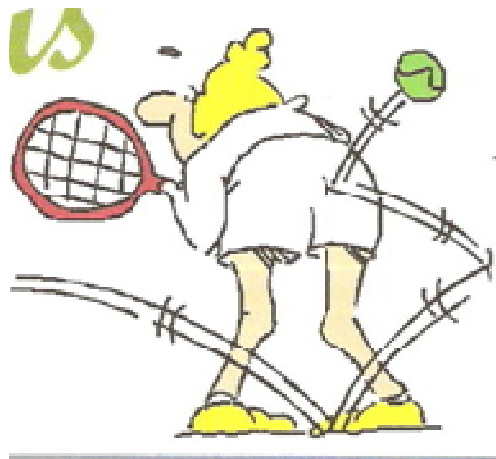

Every sporting body in the area has junior and youth teams. Local sporting bodies expend a lot of energy in satisfying the needs of sporting youth.

There is also a skate board complex at the Maleny Showgrounds for those who enjoy that type of activity.

Not all youth are sporting orientated but there are other organisations such as Naval Cadets and The Scouting Movement.

Barung Landcare also has a youth program that they foster.

The Maleny and District Historical Society welcomes ANYBODY - young or older who is interested in past Maleny history.

For those not too interested in the

adventure activities then the Maleny Singers and Maleny Players both have youth programs within their activities.

If those type of activities do not suit then there are youth activities available through the Maleny Library. Those activities include computer classes and other youth activities.

All of the local church groups have youth activities.

Students attending the Maleny High School have access to a number of external activities such as the Maleny and District Pony Club, the Trail Riding Club or the Endurance Riding Club. Other activities include engagement in motocross and mountain bike riding.

There are also opportunities through the school for public speaking, debating, drama, singing, music tuition as well as up-skilling in pottery, photography, painting and printmaking. Others are training in classical ballet, jazz and tap dancing.

Also the staff support individual students who have a particular skill or interest.

Don't just make a blanket statement that the youth of Maleny don't have things to do. There are many activities that can be accessed within this community by those who are interested enough to access them.

What is it that young people want to do that is not available within the Maleny community? I am sure that if there was a need then the community would assist.

Don't make excuses for those who will not help themselves!
