There will be a prize for the best dressed Jackaroo or Jillaroo or one of the film's other famous characters.


Doors will open at 6.00pm and the Licensed Bar will be open which will also serve Tea and coffee.

Round and round in circles

For over the past decade there has been much debate over the direction that traffic should take in Maple Street, Maleny.

During this time the volume of traffic has continued to increase and has got to a point where insufficient parking is now plaguing Maple Street businesses.

The problems with traffic were worsened with the recent closure of the exit laneway from Riverside Centre into Teak Street.

Cr. Jenny McKay, Div 5 Councillor for the Sunshine Coast Regional Council has announced that work on a \$1.5 million dollar streetscape project is to start in late 2009.

This project will include a roundabout at both ends of the business centre in Maple

Street. The roundabout at Coral and Maple Street intersection is expected to ease traffic congestion in the vicinity of the Riverside Shopping Centre car park. This roundabout will impinge on Apex Park.

The streetscape plans have taken into account the planned extensions and improvements to the Maleny Community Centre.

Whilst it was hoped to remove overhead power lines in the area it has now been deemed that the cost of doing this is prohibitive.



Mum's favourite Recipes

Chicken King

- easy evening meal on these warm afternoons.

Ingredients

- * 1 chicken 2 1/2-3 lb
- * 1/4 lb sliced mushrooms
- * 1/2 cup chopped almonds
- * 1 pimento thinly sliced or 1/2 teaspoon powdered pimento
- * 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- * salt and pepper to taste
- * 1/2 pint cream
- * 3oz butter
- * 1 wine glass sherry
- * 2 egg yolks lightly beaten
- * 1 green pepper
- * 1 pint white sauce

Method

Boil or steam chicken and remove flesh from the bones. Make white sauce using 1/2 milk and 1/2 chicken stock or 1 tin of chicken soup. Add cream to the white sauce and simmer gently. Peel and saute mushrooms and green pepper in the butter for 10 minutes, stir frequently and add to sauce mixture. Then add pimento and chicken meat, sherry and lemon juice, stir almonds and simmer for 5 minutes. Finally add egg yolks and stir constantly, cook for another minute or two. Dish may now be placed in a casserole tray in a low oven of 150oF to keep until guests arrive.


It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules.
