Maleny's connection with the surfing Bendalls

June 21st at 7.15pm at the Maleny Community Centre will be the Maleny Premier of a local documentary about Ma and Pa Bendall. This event is being sponsored by the Maleny Film Society. The Bendalls were well known Caloundra locals who pioneered surfing in Caloundra.

Launched last February in Caloundra was Michael Berry's documentary film capturing the story of the Bendalls, who discovered a love for surfing later in life.

Whilst many of us may not know the story of the Bendall we would know the old blue residence that was recently knocked down on Bulcock Beach, Caloundra still leaving a vacant block.

Harmony Lodge was in an ideal location for the surf loving couple. In the 1950's it was also a popular Caloundra beach front boarding house.

Pa died in 1973 and Ma in 2001, aged 91. The annual Pa and Ma Bendall Memorial surfing contest is held in there honour.

Much of the footage in this documentary was taken by Ma as she watched Pa and those around him enjoy the early days of Caloundra surfing.

Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

Interior & Exterior paint masking techniques.

The only purpose of masking and covering an object is to protect it from paint splatters or contact with chemicals.

Many items can and should be removed before the painting begins. These include lights, switch plates and outlet covers. Remove as many items as possible from the work area before beginning any painting project.

Unfortunately, some items can't be removed and must be covered.

Drop cloths are one component used for general covering of the floors, but you might want to mask wall areas or protect areas from over spray. When the job is completed always store the drop cloths clean so that they are ready for the next job.

Although covering tightly is always important when spray painting, you won't always have to cover items with such precision.

The techniques for covering up are the same for both interior and exterior painting.

There are a number of products available for masking

areas. The most common being masking tape of varying sizes and plastic sheeting with a masking tape on one border so that it can be attached over windows or doors etc.

With a masking tape ensure that you get one that can be left on fresh paint for a few days as the adhesive on this type of tape does not harden too quickly thus allowing it to be removed easier without paint damage.

If a tape does stick to the newly painted area try to cut the

paint skin with a sharp blade before removing. This will assist to reduce paint damage when removing.

State Parliament dictatorial

State parliament's ethics committee recently found the independent MP for Nicklin guilty of contempt for remarks he made about Speaker Mike Reynolds relating to a ban on TV news cameras filming proceedings in state parliament.

Over a long period of time television stations have been able to film proceedings in State Parliament as a true record of the day to day goings on. The Speaker, Mike Reynolds has now ruled that this is no longer permitted. Any recording will be done by the parliament in house system and sent out to the television stations for use. This creates a situation whereby the recordings can become heavily edited thus removing independence about the proceedings.

Local M.P. for Nicklin, Peter Wellington was in contempt for expressing an opposing view to the Speaker. As a result one of our representatives is not allowed to take his place in Parliament for the next 3 week. This leaves his constituents without a representative for that period of time.

The Chair-person of the Ethics Committee, "The role of the office of the Speaker is the cornerstone of parliament and respect for the speaker is essential for the power, authority and integrity of parliament," she said. It was believed that under the Westminster System of parliament parliamentarians could have views that were contrary to the Minister but apparently no longer. Perhaps the position of Speaker should be a fulltime independent public servant.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Meatballs

- good finger food with that afternoon drink.

Ingredients

- 500g lean mince - 1 cup fresh breadcrumbs - 2 tbsps olive oil
- 3 tbsps tomato chutney - 2 tbsps flat leaf parsley chopped finely
- black pepper for seasoning - 1 egg

Method

Preheat oven to 180c. Place all the ingredients except the olive oil into a bowl and mix with your hands to combine well. With damp hands take a small amount of mixture (about the size of a walnut) and shape into balls.

Heat oil in a non stick frypan and cook meatballs over medium heat for about 3 minutes or until browned all over.

Place meatballs onto a baking tray lined with baking paper and bake in oven for approx. 20 minutes or until cooked through.

Serve with tomato or BBQ sauce for dipping. - Makes 20.

Is it good enough?

A Peregian Beach man who threatened two police officers with a pistol during a nine-hour siege last year has been granted immediate parole.

Wahu Edward Hikaiti, 39, celebrated with relatives outside the Maroochydore District Court yesterday as he escaped serving a two-year-and-seven-month jail sentence. Mr Hikaiti had served 179 days from February 26 to August 23 last year. A lot less than the 2 years 7 months to which he was sentenced.

The sentence was in respect to two counts of assaulting a police officer, common assault, deprivation of liberty and threatening violence.

These offences occurred as a result of a domestic dispute on February 26 when police were called after Mr Hikaiti's partner threatened to leave him and take their eight-month-old and five-year-old children with her.

On the arrival of the police they advised Mr Hikaiti's partner to leave with the children. Mr Hikaiti said to them: "I am not letting her leave with my son."

Police attempted to arrest the offender for obstructing police, he was capsicum sprayed after resisting and put in a headlock by the police. Mr Hikaiti then grabbed the police officer's gun, causing the officer to release him.

He waved it at the male officer and then pointed it directly at the woman officer, yelling "get down on the ground". Police yelled at his partner to leave the scene and she ran next door with Mr Hikaiti's partner and their young child. Mr Hikaiti then pointed the gun at

his partner's father, who was sitting in a car outside the house with his five-year-old grandson in the car. He then put the gun on the ground and went back inside, refusing to leave.

Negotiators were called and after nine hours, at 12.20am, he surrendered.

Judge John Robertson said "This was a very serious incident and both of the police were severely traumatised and the community would not tolerate violence against police and he ordered a jail term

of two years and seven months but with immediate parole saying although it was an extremely serious crime, the accused had already spent enough time in jail."

With the ever rising statistics about domestic violence one wonders if this is an appropriate sentence in the circumstances. ***Do we need to come up with better ways of handling child custody matters and for that matter other unprovoked violent matters? Do the courts take public safety concerns into these account in these matters?***

Drought assistance

A recommendation by the National Rural Advisory Council has resulted in the Exceptional Circumstances declaration relating to drought conditions for the Sunshine Coast being lifted from 15 June.

The NRAC assists the government by assessing areas that are nearing the end of Exceptional Circumstances (EC) declarations and advising it whether conditions have deteriorated or improved. The Sunshine Coast region is deemed to have seen an improvement in conditions due to recent rains.

EC will continue in areas designated as Burnett and Northern Darling Downs.

Grants Reminder

I wish to remind community groups that are interested in the preservation of local history to consider applying to the Community Heritage Grants programme.

Applications for funding under this programme close on June 30 2008. Grants of up to \$15,000 are available for projects that aim to preserve nationally significant collections and to provide collection management training that will improve the skills of staff and volunteers.

Community organisations such as historical societies, museums, public libraries, archives, Indigenous and migrant community groups which have public collections are eligible to apply.
