Search for Daniel ends

Still a long way to go!

The official physical search for the remains of Daniel Morcombe has ended with police vacating the property at Glasshouse Mountains where they have toiled since August 13th.

The search located Daniel's remains along with his clothing and shoes.

Police Commissioner Mr Bob Atkinson said that the search was conducted by nearly 1000 SES Volunteers and 100 police personnel and took some 13,000 hours and required hand sifting of over 500 cubic metres of soil.

All items found are still the subject of forensic examination and will be used in future criminal proceedings.

"Unrollabull" does the unthinkable

The driver of a tanker carrying drinking water had a lucky escape when his trailer became detached from the prime mover as he was on the way to deliver the load.

The driver from Maleny Dairies wasn't injured in the incident and only minor damage was sustained to the vehicle.



The incident happened on Bunya Street in front of the Maleny Fire Station mid-morning on Wednesday October 11th.

Owner of the truck, Keith Hopper from Maleny Dairies, who wasn't the driver at the time of the incident said, "It is lucky that it didn't happen a bit further down Bunya Street going down the hill." He continued to say that there would have been a much worse incident at the intersection of Bunya Street and Landsborough Road just a few hundred yards further on.

The trailer, which is also used to carry milk for Maleny Dairies was righted and would be back in service later in the day justifying the truck's name, "UnRollaBull".

The Back of Beyond in Maleny!

The acclaimed award winning Movie The Back Of Beyond won the Best Film award at the Venice film festival - in 1954.

The movie tells the story of legendary outback mailman, Tom Kruse, who delivered mail to properties along the Birdsville Track.

The photo below shows the movie version of Kruse emerging over the sand hills in his reliable Leyland Badger, comes Her Majesty's Royal Mailman Tom Kruse, with his passenger William Henry, his assistant travelled in the back, ploughing through the desert to bring the mail to the people living on stations and outposts along the track – 'their only link to the outside world'.



The Lions Club of Maleny and Blackall Range are pleased to be presenting the "Outback Movie Night" on Saturday 12th November at Maleny Baptist Church starting at 7pm.

Also included in the evening will be the documentary made by the ABC in 1999 Last Mail from Birdsville. More than 750,000 people saw this movie in the 2 years after its release; it was then distributed world wide and an estimated 25 million people have seen it. When Queen Elizabeth saw the movie in 1954, she was so impressed she awarded Tom Kruse (the mailman) an MBE!

Interestingly, Lions member and Maleny resident, Ralph Ding is the nephew of the original owner of the Birdsville Mail (for whom Tom Kruse was the mailman driver). Tom and his assistant, aboriginal assistant, Henry Butler worked for Harry Ding and the first trip was made in 1930 and continued until 1960. Tom Kruse died only recently in June 2011. Tom actually drove the track between 1936 and 1952. He then set up his own business sinking dams on isolated properties in the area.

Both movies run for an hour each.

And talk about value - included in your ticket price of \$15 (children under 12 free) will be traditional damper and Billy tea at interval.

Proceeds of the evening will go to the Lions Medical Research Foundation.

Guest speaker, Mr Jack Wilcox AM, author of Rotary in Maleny – 50 years of Service (2009), spoke about Rotary's long association with the reserve and its critical role in providing easy access and enjoyment of the reserve for visitors.

The funds raised will be sent to the Ebenezer Childcare Trust in Livingstone Zambia which is taking care of 405 orphaned and vulnerable children.

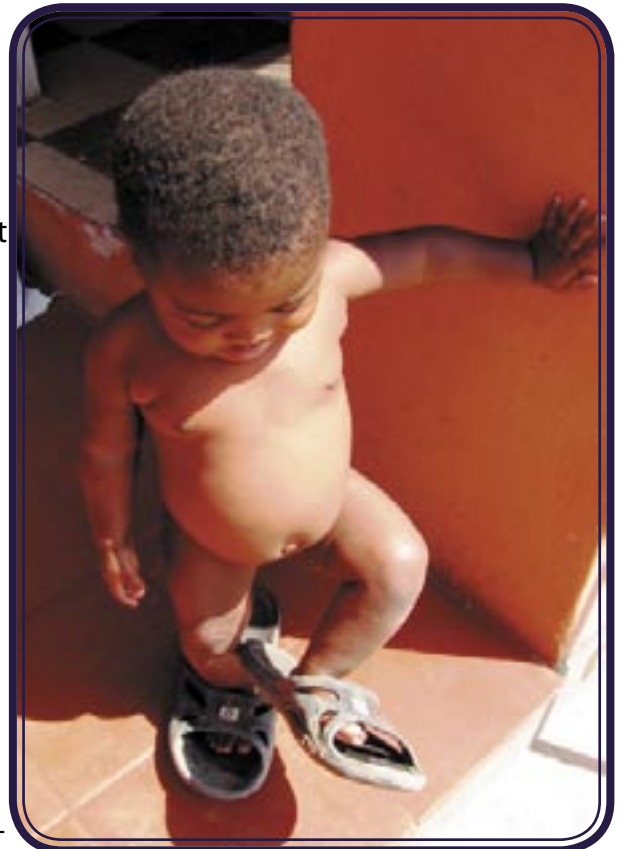
The Orphanage also provides for elderly grandparents endeavouring to raise their orphaned grand children who attend the Ebenezer School!

Mum's favourite Recipes



Lamb Meatloaf

- always a great easy Sunday night meal!

Ingredients

- * 1 onion, chopped
- * 1 garlic clove, crushed
- * 1 tbs oil
- * 1 kg lamb mince
- * 1 cup breadcrumbs
- * 1 egg
- * 27g sachet Roast Meat gravy
- * 1 tbs chopped fresh rosemary
- * 2 tbs tomato paste
- * 1 cup Frozen Mixed Vegetables potatoes and vegetables

Method

Preheat oven to 200 degrees celcius. Fry onion and garlic in oil until soft. Transfer to a large bowl. Cool for 5 mins.

Add mince, breadcrumbs, gravy mix, rosemary, tomato paste and egg to bowl. Mix well. Add frozen vegetables. Mix through.

Transfer mixture to a six-cup loaf tin and place on a baking tray.

Bake for 1 hr until cooked through. Drain off excess liquid.

Remove from tin and slice into thick pieces.

Serve with boiled potatoes and broccoli.

Question: What is the new rule regarding the exemption from wearing seat belts for medical reasons?

If your medical certificate does not have an expiry date within 12 months from the date of issue, you must wear a seatbelt or risk being fined \$300 and three demerit points.

Previously, a person who was exempt from wearing a seatbelt was required to carry a medical certificate at all times. The person must still carry the medical certificate, but the medical certificate must have an expiry date that is less than 12 months from the date the medical practitioner provided the certificate.

We are well into spring now and already there have been many bush fires burning out of control throughout Queensland.

In our area the weather conditions are such that should a fire get started it will be very difficult to control it or to stop it spreading very quickly.

There is a lot of fire fuel on the ground following such a wet and warm start to the year.

Every year it is important to be properly prepared for rural bush fires, but this year there is extra reason to be properly prepared.

If you are to be prepared then you would need to have some plan of what you are going to do in the event of a fire. A well-prepared home has an increased chance of survival in a bushfire.

That plan should have included a section on how you are reducing the hazard risk to your property. Physical hazard reduction should be, if not completed at this time be almost completed. **DO NOT LEAVE IT TOO LATE TO PREPARE YOUR PROPERTY AND YOUR SURVIVAL PLAN.**

The Rural Fire Service provides plenty of literature that will help you to make safe decisions.

It is important to be prepared - be alert, but not panicky. It is primarily your responsibility to ensure the safety of your property.

Origin & Arms of
The Family Name

O Cleirigh Cleary Clarke
Cleary is of some antiquity, dating from an early 9th-century Cleireach of the lineage of King Guaire of Connacht, renown for his hospitality. Cleireach is the Irish word for 'clerk'. Early in the 16th century a family of O Clearys were instrumental in compiling a most valuable Irish manuscript, *The annals of the Four Masters*. It was written mostly by a Franciscan monk in a ruined friary in Donegal. The Clearys had been driven from Connacht to Ulster where they were poets, churchmen and brehons (lawgivers). When the use of Gaelic names was forbidden the name was anglicised to Clarke.

Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

How to handle excess paints!

Often following the completion of that painting job there is bound to be some paints left. What do you do with this excess paint?

It is important that it is not just thrown into local creeks, the rubbish bin or thrown out with other rubbish.

Water Based Paint

Step 1

If there is only a small amount of leftover paint in the bottom of the paint can you can let it dry in the can and peel it out later.

If there is a substantial amount of leftover paint, pour excess onto absorbent material such as newspaper, cardboard, kitty litter or sawdust. Allow it to dry completely and throw away with your regular waste.

Step 2

Wash your paint brushes and rollers in a bucket of water. If the brushes need another rinse, use a second bucket of water.

Don't pour out the water in these buckets. Cover them and

store somewhere safe away from children and pets. Let them stand overnight.

Step 3

Check the buckets and you'll find the paint residue has sunk to the bottom with clear water on top. Now pour the top water onto your lawn or open garden area. Repeat step 1 for the residual amount of paint solids in the bottom of each bucket.

Step 4

Steel is 100% recyclable so you can now recycle the empty steel paint can. Most councils recycle steel either through a kerbside collection service or via drop off facilities. Check with your council before putting paint cans in your recycling bin.

Oil-Based Paint

These paints are flammable and toxic and definitely should not be poured down stormwater drains, into gutters or onto the ground.

Step 1

Ask a Paint Place Consultant to advise you on the exact amount to ensure minimal left over paint.

Step 2

If you do have leftover paint, correct storage will ensure your paint

is fresh for future touch ups or second coats. For best results, cover the top of the open can with cling wrap and put the lid on securely to avoid leakage. Store the can upside down. The paint naturally forms a skin, which will help to seal the can and keep it fresh for next time.

Step 3

After painting, wash out paint brushes and rollers with mineral turpentine or a white spirit. Follow steps 2 and 3 (from water based paints) by using these chemicals instead of water.

Save the clear liquid above the paint solids in a labelled container for future projects. Remove paint solids from the bottom of the container and dispose of in your local council's household hazardous chemical waste collection service.

Step 4

Mineral turpentine, paint thinners and oil-based paints are considered hazardous chemical waste. To dispose of these products safely, contact your local council.

Most councils offer a household hazardous chemical waste collection service and some allow drop offs at their waste disposal centres on specific days.

Every "kid" will just love this display

Very quickly we are forgetting about Queensland's past, and Queensland relied on the construction of a rail network to allow for growth throughout the state.

That past can be followed at the Workshops Rail Museum at Ipswich. During the period of its operation it not only manufactured items for Queensland Rail but for many other government departments. It provided employment for hundreds of Queenslanders.

Many of the skills developed there are being lost.

The Museum is also the home of an upcoming Queensland Model Railway Show on the 29th and 30th October 2011.



At this show the spotlight is on the skill, intricate designs and passion of the much loved hobby of miniature trains.

Adults and children alike can expect to spend time viewing various sized displays anywhere from half a square metre to 48 square metres, of fictitious and real detailed scenery.

Visitors will see the different scales of models available to the hobbyist from N scale layouts, and HO being 1:87 in ratio to a real steam locomotive, which will also be on display and surrounded by many miniature versions.



"What sets this show apart from other modelling exhibitions is the opportunity to learn and pick up tips, as experienced modellers will be conducting demonstrations, tutorials and are all too happy to share their passion with others.

"Train modelling might appear to visitors to be toys for big kids, though the past-time takes patience, fine motor skills and great attention to detail, to work with such small items." Mr Moritz Director of The Workshops Rail

Museum said.

Younger modellers can demonstrate their skills in the Construction Zone, Tiny Train Creation Station, and enjoy miniature live steam train rides. Some activities will incur an additional charge.

Popular construction worker Bob the Builder will be entertaining audiences with three exciting shows

starting at 11am, 12noon and 1pm.

Experience the full scale of the show by taking a one and half hour ride on the real thing aboard a heritage steam train from The Workshops Rail Museum platform through the countryside. Extra charges apply and bookings are essential.

The Workshops Rail Museum is part of the Queensland Museum.
