Bob Abbott won't be our next Mayor

Mayor of the Sunshine Coast Regional Council, Mayor Bob Abbott announced on Thursday July 14th at a press conference that he will not contest the mayoral position at the next local government election. This election is due to be held in March 2012.

Mr Abbott has been in local government for 30 years of which 26 years he was on the Noosa Council and of that 26 years he was Mayor of Noosa for 10 years.

At the press conference he said that he wanted to make his intentions known well before the lead into the local government elections next year.

In his statement Mr Abbott said, "The challenge for the mayor and councillors of the next Sunshine Coast Council will be to balance our population

and economic development and maintaining a sustainable fabric that will support the coast well into the future."

He continued. "When I was elected as mayor in 2008, I was determined to lay a foundation for the Sunshine Coast during the first 4-6 years of local government and I'm proud to say we have done that during our first term as a new council."

This period of council has not been a particularly happy period with animosity between a number of councillors often rearing its head.

At this time there have been no actual nominations or official expressions of interest for the role, but Two councillors, Deputy Mayor Tim Dwyer and North Shore Councillor Debbie Blumel are the most likely contenders.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Garlic Pork + Choko



Ingredients

- * 500g pork mince
- * 2 chokos, peeled & sliced into batons
- * 5 tablespoons vegetable oil
- * 2 tablespoon sugar
- * 4 tablespoons finely diced garlic
- * 2 tablespoon water
- * 8 spring onions, cut into 5 cm lengths
- * tablespoons fish sauce
- * 4 tablespoons light soy sauce
- * 1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- * 3 birds eye chilli, finely sliced

Method

In a mixing bowl combine 1 tablespoon sugar, pepper & 1 tablespoon fish sauce. Mix well then add to mince and marinate for 10 minutes.

In a hot fry pan, add vegetable oil and fry the garlic until fragrant. Add the mince and stir fry until brown, then remove and set aside.

Add the choko to the same hot pan then add remaining fish sauce, sugar and water. Stir then cover and cook on medium heat for 5 minutes.

Add spring onions, mince and toss well for a further minute.

Queensland legislation made hard-wired smoke alarms compulsory in newly built and substantially renovated homes from 1997 and at least a 9 volt battery operated smoke alarm in pre 1997 built homes.

Smoke alarms installed in the late 1990's, if they haven't been replaced, are now well past their serviceable life.

Both hard wired and battery operated smoke alarms are manufactured to have a recommended service life of at least 10 years under normal conditions of use.

After 10 years smoke alarms may malfunction and their efficiency compromised with accumulated dust, insects, airborne contaminants and corrosion of electrical circuitry.

Most smoke alarms have an expiry or replace by date written on them so for your family's sake please check yours now!

Origin & Arms of The Family Name



The family name Cannon was primarily an English nickname from the Middle English *canun* or 'canon', a clergyman living with others in a clergy house, brought to England as the Old Norman French *canonnie* or *canoine* from the Latin *canon* meaning 'rule' or 'discipline'. Most early bearers of the name were serfs who perhaps gained the name from a certain dignity or bearing. The name is also the Anglicized form of the Irish Gaelic *O Canain*, or 'descendant of Canan', a personal name derived from *cana* or 'wolf-cub' and also *Manx*, being the Anglicised form of *MacCananain*, 'son of Canannan', a personal name of uncertain origin.

Track Telstra outages on the web!

A new Telstra Country Wide website will give customers on the Sunshine Coast up-to-date information on network outages and restoration activities during major outages and natural disasters.

Telstra Country Wide Area General Manager for Sunshine Coast, Kris Carver, said the new website was developed as a result of the natural disasters around the country during the 2010/11 summer.

"Communication is vital during a disaster and we pride ourselves on our local team's response during these times. This website will help us give people the information they need at a time that suits them," he said.

"Our regional customers can access the information from the website at their convenience, without having to call Telstra or waiting for the next news bulletin. It will also allow family and friends, who may be concerned about people in disaster areas, to check updates on the network.

"During periods of normal operation, this website will enable people to check what is happening to landline, broadband, or mobile services in the region simply by entering the relevant postcode. It

will provide the latest outage information," said Mr Carver.

"During a natural disaster, it will be expanded to include suburb or town name, with the status of landline, broadband and mobile services in each town. It will also include a map to highlight the affected areas.

"In addition, the website will assist people by providing them a link to report a fault and details on how to apply for disaster assistance packages where available," he said.

Telstra Country Wide has a history of learning from its response to natural disasters and how to do things better in the future. From the Black Saturday Bushfires of 2009, Telstra developed the Mobile Exchange on Wheels (MEOW) to quickly restore damaged exchanges or mobile towers in the absence of standard operating equipment.

Telstra's mobile exchanges and towers were used widely during the Brisbane Floods and Cyclone Yasi to keep people connected.

The Sunshine Coast Council has approved a systematic inspection program for the Sunshine Coast Regional Council in accordance with the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008; Chapter 5, Part 2, Section 113 (5) (d). It relates to a compliance audit of premises for Regulated Dog Permits. This inspection will be conducted between August 1st, 2011 and October 31st 2011.

Another interesting proposed law amendment to conditions relating to pigeons and aviary birds in Schedule 3 (2) (a) be amended to 6 metres from any residence on an adjoining lot. Will that affect you?

Ex-service personnel former members of the ships' companies of HMA Ships Tobruk and Jervis Bay may be eligible for the Australian Active Service Medal with Clasp 'SOMALIA'.
