## Search for Daniel Continues

Almost a month after the final search started and two weeks after the first human bones were found at Kings Road, Glasshouse Mountains more human bones have been found.

MORE human remains have been uncovered in the search for Daniel Morcombe. They were found in the same area that human remains have previously been found.

Sunshine Coast police advised that more human remains had been found over the weekend of September and were being sent for forensic testing. A police spokesperson said, "In view of the present circumstances it is most likely that this find relates to the Daniel Morcombe case."

Two shoes have previously been found and results are still to be received as to their ownership.

Daniel disappeared on December 7th, 2003 from Woombye whilst going to do his christmas shopping.

Police Media report that the Morcombe family had been kept updated with what is happening at the search location. They are presently on an education tour of Queensland delivering a message about child safety.

Police and the Morcombe family have now taken to make weekly announcements about significant developments instead of daily press releases.

## *Directors needed for MCU Limited*

**In a letter dated September 7th the Maleny Credit Union announced a vote on the appointment of Directors at the forthcoming AGM to be held on October 8th, 2011 at 10.30a.m. at the Maleny RSL hall.**

The MCU Board has to have at least six directors and up to ten, however at this point only four have been nominated and accepted as just nominations.

The four who are expected to be appointed as directors at the next AGM are;

elected at the 2011 AGM has the power to appoint casual or additional directors.

The 2011 AGM is possibly one of the most important annual meetings following the defeat of the possible merger with CUA by members.

This incoming board and directors will have the task of ensuring that the MCU remains not only solvent, but successful into the foreseeable future. Their actions will be an important step towards ensuring members assets.

## *Mt. Tibrogargan claims another life*

With the aid of a rescue helicopter volunteer members of the Glasshouse Emergency Service group and police recovered the body of a young woman from the sides of Mt. Tibrogargan in the Glasshouse Mountains on Monday September 12th.

The woman had been climbing the mountain on September 9th when it appears that she fell down a cliff of about 80 metres. The woman had been climbing alone when she fell.

A SES volunteer who had been attending a training course on September 9th when un-attended backpack was noticed at on the mountain. Police were subsequently advised.

A search was commenced, but was called off late on that afternoon because of poor weather and fading light. The search recommenced on the following morning.

Police have not released further details of this incident.

## Sunshine Coast Hinterland is vibrant and shows the diversity of the area

The Sunshine Coast Council has just realised something that we all have known for a long time. That is that one of the most endearing qualities of the Sunshine Coast is the vibrancy and diversity of its hinterland.

Sunshine Coast Council wants to make sure the hinterland remains that way into the future – so it wants your ideas, input and creative thinking to prepare a strategy which does just that!

Economic Development and Council Entrepreneurship portfolio councillor Lew Brennan said the hinterland was a key element in the Coast's diversity in terms of economic activity.

"There are so many facets of economic activity in country towns and villages, which are just as sensitive to the variances of economic cycles as the rest of the Coast," he said.

"It is important that we understand fully how they interlink and what we can do to make them as sustainable as possible, as well as look at opportunities for their economic growth.

"I encourage everyone to contribute to the website forum or attend one of the workshops."

Glasshouse Mountains pineapple farmer Murray Pike said food security "will be a major issue inside 20 years" and also believes more industrial land for hinterland towns is needed. He also said friction between operating farms and urban areas was increasing.

Maleny IGA supermarket owner

Rob Outridge said tourism was a major economic driver for the hinterland.

"We are an alternative to the Gold Coast and the hinterland has to offer something different – country towns need to retain their country feel," he said.

The issues are clearly as numerous and diverse as the hinterland population itself. That's why council wants to hear from as many people as possible.

Council is conducting an open, online community forum as well as holding workshops around the Coast.

You can answer questions listed as well as link to a variety of information sources – and you will be able to read contributions by others and continue the conversation.

When all the feedback is in, Council will identify the strongest issues which will feed into a draft Rural Futures Strategy.

## Mum's favourite Recipes

### Chilli con carne

- quick Sunday night!



#### Ingredients

- \* 2 teaspoons olive oil
- \* 125g rindless bacon, roughly chopped
- \* 750g lean beef mince
- \* 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- \* 2 medium brown onions, finely chopped
- \* 2 medium red capsicums, chopped
- \* 1 long red chilli, chopped
- \* 800g can chopped tomatoes
- \* 2 tablespoons Mexican chilli powder
- \* 400g can red kidney beans, drained, rinsed toppings

#### Directions

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add bacon. Cook for 5 to 6 minutes or until crisp. Add mince. Cook, stirring with a wooden spoon to break up mince, for 15 minutes or until browned.

Add onions, capsicums, garlic and chopped chilli. Cook for 5 to 6 minutes or until vegetables are soft. Add chilli powder. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant.

Add tomatoes and 1 cup cold water. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to mediumlow. Simmer, partially covered, for 30 minutes or until sauce has reduced slightly.

Add beans. Increase heat to medium. Cook for 15 minutes or until beans are heated through and sauce has thickened. Serve chilli with toppings.

Another room in the house that can be a fire hazard is the laundry.

Clothes dryers are often responsible for laundry fires. Remembering to clean the lint out of a clothes dryer filter as often as possible, will help prevent the machine overheating and will go a long way towards preventing house fires.

By following a few simple steps below householders can help prevent a clothes dryer fire:

Clean the lint filters in clothes dryers after every load

Make sure that each load goes through a full cycle, giving the dryer an opportunity to cool down

Regularly dust the grill of the clothes dryer to prevent dust build up and overheating.

Don't overload power points in the laundry.

Ensure there is proper ventilation and air space around the clothes dryer.

From time-to-time, clean the lint filter in soapy water to remove any build up of material over the filter.

Turn dryer off before leaving the house.

Conghaile, is the original Gaelic version of Connolly, and meaning 'valorous'. They were an ancient sept of Connacht who in time separated and dispersed as three distinct families. They are still mainly based around counties cork, Meath and Monaghan, where they are one of the 'Four Tribes of Tara'. In Monaghan, about 1591, Tiriough O Connolly is recorded as being chief of the name. Because of his dazzling wealth the most famous Connolly was an early 18th-century William Connolly from Donegal whose family paved the way to success by conforming to the religion of Establishment. 'Little Mo', the meteoric USA tennis star of the 50s, was a Connolly.

## Kenilworth Country Foods’ steps up to help local kids

Thanks to donation of \$1,503.60 which was organised by Kenilworth Country Foods and a number of local businesses including: Queensland Yoghurt Company, Maxum Foods, Tate and Lyle, Shamrock Foods, Anthony Spencer Group Consultancy, 50 disadvantaged Kenilworth and Conondale children will be going to school with warm and dry feet.

The funds were donated to the Brighter Future 4 Kids Foundation’s (BF4KF) Shoes & Socks 4 Kids program which provides free leather BATA shoes and Underworks socks to disadvantaged children in need going to school with no shoes or worn out shoes with holes, or that are held together with staples or tape.

Pauline Preston, BF4KF Managing Director said; “Kenilworth Country Foods came to our rescue – we were struggling to raise the funds we needed to provide shoes and socks for children in need in the Kenilworth and Conondale areas. Importantly this amazing donation means that no child has to miss out.”

“The scale of their generosity is amazing and is enabling us to assist children in need from these schools not only now, but for Back to School as well to assist Prep children in need starting their first ever year of school.” The charity conducted a survey of state primary schools throughout the Sunshine Coast and identified 864 children in need.

“For children arriving at school sick or wet, or not even arriving at all due to holes in their shoes - the challenges of learning can become overwhelming. They find it extremely hard to concentrate and retain information and often have more medical problems. They can also become the subject of cruel teasing and taunts,” Rose said.

It costs just \$29.95 to give one child a brand new pair of BATA leather school shoes and three pairs of Underworks socks delivered to their school.

The Brighter Future 4 Kids Foundation is 100 per cent volunteer run, so 100 per cent of their efforts go to helping kids in need.

Kenilworth Foods General Manager Corey Janssen said: “We are very proud to support the Shoes & Socks 4 Kids program and look forward to the new shoes and socks being delivered to kids in need at Conondale and Kenilworth State Schools in the next 4 – 5 weeks.”

“The importance of a simple project like this in our community cannot be underestimated. It can quite literally mean the difference between whether a child in need goes to school or not, and helps them be ready to learn and take advantage of their best opportunity to escape the poverty trap – their education,” Corey added.

## The Musings of an old codger!

Whilst it might not really be a local issue it is an issue that as ratepayers we have to think about.

That matter is the approval this week by the State Government's Urban Land Development Council of a housing estate surrounding the Caloundra Airport.

How long do you think that it will take for those who buy land there and set up their home to start to agitate to have the airport shut down because of the noise.

The airport provides secure employment to many local people and for the airport to be shut down would mean that those specialist people would have to leave the area.

The Caloundra Airport is an important asset to Sunshine Coast Ratepayers. With the increase of "fly in miners" it should become an important hub for both maintenance and destination for smaller charter operators.

It is hard enough already for people to find work in the Sunshine Coast area and to find that another avenue of employment is lost would be beyond belief.

Our area cannot afford to become just a residential area for workers who cannot find work locally. Some common sense is needed.

For the developers this is just another greedy grab that will put ordinary people at a disadvantage.

It should be conditioned on the sale of the land that no complaints ever can be made about noise from the airport.

## Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place **All brushes aint brushes for painting**

It doesn't matter whether you paint your own home or you get a professional painter to complete the job it can be an expensive exercise.

edge is used for edging, along mouldings and for cutting in on rollerwork.

### Bristles

In general, water-based paints use synthetic-bristle brushes and oil-based paints use natural bristles. Better brushes have the bristles well anchored, saving time in removing loose bristles from your paintwork. However, any new brush may have a few loose bristles so remove these whilst the brush is dry by flicking the bristle.
