Young male found dead on Old Caloundra Road, just outside of Landsborough

At about 10p.m. on Thursday July 8th a report by a passing motorist to the Queensland Ambulance service indicated that there was an injured male person on the side of Old Caloundra Road just outside of Landsborough.

On the arrival of the ambulance crew they found the body of a deceased male person, aged 24. The deceased person appeared to have suffered a gunshot wound.

Police immediately cordoned off the apparent crime scene and set up a major incident room at the Caloundra Police Station to investigate the matter. Experts in forensics, ballistics and fingerprints are working with local detectives and homicide detectives to investigate this death.

This incident follows another incident earlier at about 6.45a.m. in Toohey Road at Caboolture where a male person had hijacked two female occupants of a car at gunpoint and made off with it.



The offender in that instance is a male person who is described as aged in his 40s, tall, of a slim build and was wearing black motorcycle leathers and a helmet.

This incident occurred after the two females had stopped to assist the male person who had fallen off his motor cycle. The motor bike had been stolen from a property in Kallangur earlier.

Police located that car in a burnt out condition around 2.40pm on Dobson Lane at Bellmere.

Det Supt Carless of Queensland police said, "There's no information at this time to substantiate a link with the Caboolture incident." Det Supt Carless said, "It is too early to comment on whether he believed drugs or outlaw bikie gangs were involved in the incident. We are not "ruling anything in or ruling anything out" yet."

A 37 year old man has been arrested in relation to this matter. Anyone with further information should contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Meatballs Hawaiian

great meatballs and rice!

Ingredients

- * 450g Mince Steak * 1 Teaspoon Water * 1/4 Cup Vinegar
- * 1/4 Cup Flour * 2 Tablespoons Cornflour * 1 Egg
- * 1/4 Teaspoon Ginger * 2 Green Peppers (Seeded & cut into strips)
- * 1/4 Cup Brown Sugar * 1 Can Pineapple Chunks
- * 1/2 Teaspoon Salt * 3 Tablespoons Salad Oil
- * 1 Tablespoon Soy Sauce

Method

- 1. Season mince steak with salt and ginger.
- 2. Lightly beat egg with one teaspoon water.
- 3. Form mince steak into 16 small balls.
- 4. Dip each meatball in beaten egg mix.
- 5. Roll each meatball in flour.
- 6. Saute meatballs in warm salad oil browning the balls completely.
- 7. Remove meatballs from oil.
- 8. Drain syrup from pinapple and add water to syrup to make one cup of syrup/water mix.
- 9. Stir liquid into oil in pan.
- 10. Stir in brown sugar mixed with corn flour, vinegar & soy sauce.
- 11. Heat mixture, stirring constantly until sauce thickens and boils (about 3 minutes).
- 12. Arrange meatballs, pepper strips and pineapple chunks in seperate piles in pan of sauce.
- 13. Stir gently until ingredients covered in sauce.
- 14. Cover pan and simmer for 10 minutes.

Serve with boiled rice or hot buttered noodles.

Will you be prepared for the next summer fire season?

In places where bushland adjoins urban and semi-rural residential areas, it is important that effective bushfire prevention measures are put in place - both by local councils, other landholders and residents

Now is a great time for residents in high hazard areas to undertake bushfire prevention activities.

By working closely with the Queensland Fire and Rescue Service (QFRS) and the Rural Fire Service (RFS) it is possible to ensure effective prevention measures are in place before the next fire season arrives.

Once that season is upon us it is normally too late to ensure that our bushland homes are adequately protected.

Whilst various levels of government have some responsibilities in regard to ensuring bushland homes safety the primary responsibility remains with the homeowner.

As part of a hazard reduction program Rural Fire Brigades often carries out prescribed burning of prepared sections of land deemed to be hazardous. Vale Inspector "Jack" Mason

Inspector John (Black Jack) Mason, a retired Queensland Police Officer was found dead at his Burgess Avenue, Maleny residence by his wife, Gloria mid afternoon on Wednesday July 7th. He was found by his wife Gloria crushed to death after his vehicle apparently slid off a jack whilst he was working on the vehicle. It is believed that he would have died instantly.

Inspector Mason retired from the Queensland Police Service about 15 years ago. He had joined the Queensland police in 1958 at 16 years of age and served as a typist. He was well known to many police officers still serving in the Sunshine Coast area. He was a police officer who might be described as of the old school.

Inspector Mason served in many parts of Queensland including Brisbane, Gold Coast, Mareeba, Maroochydore, Coolangatta and Redcliffe. Whilst he was stationed at Maroochydore he was an Inspector responsible for overseeing the Maleny area and it was during that time that he decided that he wanted to spend his retirement in Maleny.

Mr Mason was involved in community organisations in Maleny including the Sacred Heart Catholic parish in Maleny.

Earlier on the day that he died he was talking with retired work colleagues about his preparations for an overseas adventure with his wife, Gloria to visit their youngest daughter, Jillian and his grand-daughter, Joshua, one of his seven beloved grandchildren.

The funeral was held at the Maleny Catholic Church on July 14th.

Boy has arm broken in vehicle accident

Emergency crews from Maleny and the AGL Action Rescue Service responded to a report of the single vehicle crash at Conondale north of Maleny at 1.30pm on Wednesday July 7th.

A 14 year old boy who was an ocupant of the vehicle which rolled down an embankment had his arm broken in the incident.

It was necessary for firefighters to use hydraulic cutting equipment to cut the passenger free from the vehicle.

He was taken to the Nambour Hospital where he was admitted in a stable condition.

The driver of the vehicle received minor injuries and was treated at the scene and allowed to go home.

Witta house destroyed by fire

Fire totally destroyed a two-storey timber home at Witta, west of Maleny on the night of Thursday July 8th.

The home has been under construction over a number of years by the owner and was set to be placed on the market for sale.

All that is left of the newly-completed home which sits on its acreage block overlooking a small lake is a pile twisted metal roofing and brick house stumps.

Fire crews from Maleny were alerted late on Thursday night and arrived at the scene shortly before midnight. Queensland Fire Service spokesperson, Ross Hopper said, "When we arrived the wind was blowing a gale and the fire was really pumping. There is very little you can do in those circumstances and the home was destroyed very quickly."

A spokesperson for the Queensland Police Service said that inquiries were being made into the cause of the fire in this instance but there does not appear to be any suspicious circumstances involved.

No person was injured in this incident. It is unknown if the house was insured at the time of the fire.

A report will subsequently be furnished to the coroner.

This fire followed another house fire in Western Avenue, Montville

at about 11.30p.m. on Wednesday July 7th.

A police spokesperson said that there is no suspicious circumstances surrounding this fire. It is possible that it was caused by candles left burning.

The only occupant of the house was asleep at the time of the fire but was awaken by the sound of his dog barking. He escaped the fire without injuries.

The spokesperson continued that candles should not be left burning when unattended by a conscious person and never left burning in close proximinity to flammable items.
