Are we getting a golf course?

The new Mayor of the Sunshine Coast Regional Council, Bob Abbot said yesterday, "I don't think an 18-hole golf course covering that whole precinct is appropriate - I never have and never will and it is far from a done deal."

This was in response to indications that the new Sunshine Coast Regional Council was preparing to revisit the controversial course planned for council-owned land known as the Maleny Community Precinct after the project was approved by the outgoing Caloundra City Council.

The push to build the course on property formerly owned by Steve Porter's at North Maleny has divided Maleny's residents for a number of years. Many see it as another divide between Maleny residents similar to the "Woolworths battle".

A vocal section of people in the town are unhappy to see such significant land situated close to the hinterland town's centre devoted

to a golf course. "I think there is a real opportunity for a shared process there - a real opportunity for the whole town of Maleny to benefit from that." said Mr Abbott.

Mr Abbot said the Maleny community would have another chance to contribute its views as to how the land should be used and so discussions with members of community organisations in Maleny will commence soon.

Mr Abbott continued, "My perspective is that I don't think using all that land for an 18-hole golf course is appropriate, so we will certainly be doing what we can to resolve that."

An application will be made by the new council to excise two lots along North Maleny Road which would be retained by the land's original owner, Steve Porter, as part of the terms of his original deal with the Caloundra City Council.

Quality Paint accessories can make the job easier

Rollers, Pads, Brushes, Painter's Tape, and Paints; every year, new products come on the market to help make painting more enjoyable. You'll want to select the best ones for your job.

Natural or Synthetic Brushes

Paint brushes with natural bristles are meant for oil-based paints. Natural bristles will soak up the water and go limp in water-based paints. The newer synthetic bristles were designed for water-based or acrylic paints, but can be used for anything. Densely packed bristles that taper to a chisel edge help with painting a straight edge, cutting in or tipping. Split ends or "flags" hold more paint and spread it more evenly and smoothly. Choose the right brush for your job.

Foam Brushes and Rollers

Foam brushes come in many widths, are inexpensive, and are great for small jobs or touch-ups.

Foam paint rollers work well, don't spatter the paint, and are easy to use when you want a really smooth wall. Don't try them on rough surfaces, though, as they will not hold up.

Pad Painters

Smooth pad painters offer simple and neat paint application and easy clean ups. Don't apply too much paint to the pad, as it will drip. You'll have to take it apart, clean it, dry it thoroughly, and start over.

Paint Rollers

A paint roller with a plastic core will last longer than one with a cardboard core. Select a roller "nap" (fullness of the covering) according to the texture on your walls. Use a flat, smooth roller for flat, smooth walls and a thicker, more plush roller for rough textured walls.

Drop Cloths

The best material for a drop cloth is a heavy canvas cloth. It's not as slippery as plastic and covers better than newspaper. Fold the cloth to fit any size room and tape down the corners to prevent paint from oozing over the edge. To prevent scratching, be sure to vacuum hardwood floors before you put the drop cloth down.

The "NUT" Award

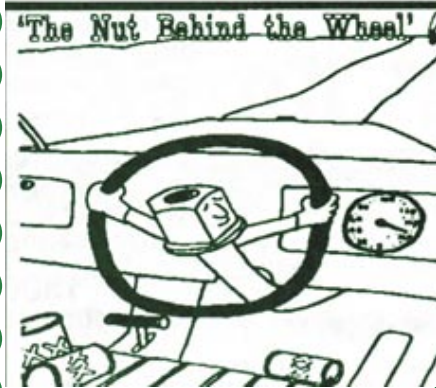
It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Tangy Rib Eye Fillets

- There is nothing like a good steak.

Ingredients

1/2 cup soy sauce - 1/4 cup real maple syrup - 6 cloves garlic, minced - 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger - 1 teaspoon mustard powder - 1/2 teaspoon sesame oil - 1/4 teaspoon Tabasco sauce - 1/2 cup beer - 4 (10 ounce) beef rib eye steaks

Directions:

In a medium size mixing bowl, combine soy sauce, maple syrup, chopped garlic, grated ginger root, sesame oil, Tabasco sauce, and mix well to blend. Now add beer and stir lightly to mix. Prepare steaks by scoring any fatty outside areas on steak with a knife, (this prevents the steaks from curling when barbecuing). Place steaks in a casserole dish and pour marinade over. Using a fork, punch holes in steaks so that the marinade penetrates into the steaks. Turn steaks over and repeat punching holes.

Cover with clear wrap or foil and let marinate in the refrigerator for at least 1 hour or longer. You can also refrigerate and marinate overnight.

Prepare and preheat barbecue to high heat. Place steaks directly on grill and sear one side for about 15 seconds. Turn steaks over and cook for about 5 minutes, then turn over and cook for another 5 minutes for medium-rare, depending on thickness. Test for doneness by cutting into the middle of the steak.

Ever fantasised about being in the pilot seat of the greatest fighter plane of WW11? Well, The Queensland Air Museum at Caloundra Airport will have a Canberra B20 bomber and Second World War Spitfire fighter aircraft open for inspection between 10am to 4pm on Anzac Day, Friday, April 25.

This is also a great way to remember the exploits of those who flew these machines and gave their all to ensure our countries safety.

A voluntary gold coin donation will get you a seat in the Canberra, and \$5 per adult or \$10 per family will give you a seat in the Spitfire. Proceeds will go to Legacy and the restoration of museum aircraft.

Many other aircraft operated by the Australian military will also be on display.

Navy Allowance

A new allowance is expected to be introduced to retain sailors and submariners in the Navy.

The allowances of \$24,000 to general service sailors and \$60,000 to submariners with ranks between Able Seaman to Chief Petty Officer will be available to more than 6000 sailors and 250 submariners who agree to a further 18 months of service.

The incentive payments aim to address workforce shortages in the Australian Defence Force.
