Open day at Pattemore House

Heritage listed Pattemore House in North Maleny came alive last Sunday afternoon. In perfect weather, the Pattemore clan came from near and far to relive fond memories of days gone by. They were joined by members of the Maleny Historical Society and Friends of Pattemore House who provided a traditional spread of cakes, tea and coffee. Stan Collard and Rob Pattemore, Presidents of each society, welcomed guests.

It was the first Open Day organised by the Friends. "What made this day special" said Sue McCleary, Secretary of the Friends "was to have guided tours of the four roomed home by Pattemore family members who grew up here or visited relatives here many years ago." Some Pattemores happily referred to themselves as the 'chattermores', and their many anecdotes gave credence to this.

In all, about fifty family and friends listened to Heritage architect Roger Todd talk about the historical significance of the property and its surrounds. Pattemore House is one of the oldest and best preserved farm

houses in the district. Roger stressed its importance stemmed from the fact that it was a fine in situ example of living conditions of our pioneers

"Fairview", as the house was originally called, was constructed in 1907 by the Pattemore sons for their parents, John Robert and Emily Pattemore, from beechwood, sourced and pit-sawed on the property. Roger attributed the house's good condition to the use of beech timber "and a bit of luck".

The farm house was heritage listed by the Queensland Heritage Council in 2003 at the instigation of the Pattemore family - some eight years after the 64ha former dairy farm was acquired by Caloundra City Council for effluent disposal and sporting activities. Accordingly, Council then rezoned the farm from rural to 'open space, sport and recreation'.

Roger stressed

the importance of retaining the charm of the rural setting and the vistas from the house across to Porters Wood. He also emphasised the need to find a sustainable use for the property as the best way of preserving its unique character.

The Friends of Pattemore House are keen to assist the Historical Society handle the restoration once the Sunshine Coast Council issues a lease. Council, at its budget deliberations, will consider a recommendation that \$150,000 be allocated to assist with the restoration work on one of Maleny's finest old farm houses.

Maleny Singers' latest production

This year Maleny Singers will be performing 'Orpheus in the Underworld', an operetta by Jacques Offenbach, at the Maleny Community Centre for a limited season commencing with a Gala Opening Night on Friday 3rd July 2009.

This production will be accompanied by the Maleny Performing Arts Orchestra and, for the first time, introducing a group of young vibrant local dancers who are busy rehearsing for this performance with their teacher and choreographer Catherine Gray. These young dancers are very excited to be included in one of the major theatrical events in Maleny this year.

'Orpheus in the Underworld' was the first of Offenbach's outrageously funny 'send ups' of Greek mythology and is an unashamedly Gallic version of the classic legend of Orpheus's pursuit of his wife Eurydice, who has been carried off to Hades by Pluto – much to the annoyance of Jupiter.

This is a highly disrespectful romp and involves nymphs, shepherds, gods and goddesses, with the fun reaching its climax in the riotous revels of the famous "Can-can".

It is a lively and highly enjoyable show for both performers and audience this performance includes many world-famous tunes.

Performances commence on Friday 3rd July 2009 at 6.30pm with tables of 8 with a licensed bar and don't forget to bring a hamper (food only). There will be the usual prize for the 'best dressed' table.

Further performances on Sunday 5th July at 4.00pm, Saturday 11th and Sunday 12th at 6.30pm.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Hearty potato soup

- a great warmer in this cooler weather.

Ingredients

- * 4 slices bacon
- * 4 large chopped onions
- * 4 large cubed potatoes
- * 4 cups hot water
- * 4 chicken stock cubes
- * 1oz butter
- * 2 tablespoons flour
- * 1 tablespoon parsley
- * 1 cup sour cream

Method

Saute bacon, remove from pan and cut into small pieces.

Saute chopped onions. To onions and bacon add flour, crumble in stock cubes and stirring to thicken, add hot water, add slices potatoes, salt and pepper to taste and simmer carefully until potatoes are tender but not mushy.

Before serving stir in sour cream.
