Sunshine Coast Council election results in Div 5 close

A week after the first election for the new Sunshine Coast Regional Council the polls still have not been declared.

Division 5 which includes Maleny, Witta, Conondale and surrounding areas is still a close race. The official number of voters enrolled at the closed of the rolls was 17,904. With 86% of the vote counted the Queensland Electoral Commission has released the figures below:-

Dick Newman	-3,018	-20.05%
Ron Green	-812	-5.39%
Jenny McKay	-5,506	-36.58%
Winston Johnston	-5,225	-34.71%
Ron Campbell	-492	-3.27%

Sunshine Coast electoral returning officer David McKenzie said, "Postal votes can be received until 10 days after the election, and there is no deadline for the returning officer to declare a winner in any division."

Mrs Jenny McKay, former Maroochy Councillor is expected to take out Division 5 after pre-poll and postal votes are counted. She has not claimed victory as yet as she believes that the count is still too close with Maleny candidate, former Caloundra City Councillor Winston Johnston polling very strongly, especially in the hinterland section of the electorate.

Mr. Johnston said, "If I don't get into council I will still be keeping a close look at what is going on in the hinterland and will continue to work for the good of the local community."

The new Mayor for the Sunshine Coast Super Council, the fourth largest in Australia will be Mayor Bob Abbott, former Mayor of Noosa beating former Maroochy Mayor, Joe Natoli with a massive 70% of the primary vote.

How does the council amalgamation effect the way you do business with council?

It doesn't matter whether you just live in the Sunshine Coast hinterland or you run a business there there is one thing for certain and that is you will have to do business with the local council.

What happens now that the three local councils no longer exist? Well, from a practical point of view - nothing. You continue to do business as you did before. Don't let them get you.....

Of recent weeks there have been a number of emails received from various circles requesting verification of email user names and passwords. The internet is an easy place to disguise ones real identity, so it's essential that you confirm who an individual is before conducting business with them.

The internet is a great tool, but can be a place where fraud is easily committed but difficult to police. Internet fraudsters will stop at nothing to get your important security information by contacting you by email.



Any reputable bank or internet provider, or any other reputable business for that matter would never ask for your username and password. Normally these emails are carefully crafted to appear legitimate. Obtaining personal information in this manner is known as phishing.

If you receive an email requesting personal information, we recommend you ignore it and delete it immediately. You should also contact the organisation that allegedly sent the email to advise them of the incident so that they can take the appropriate security action.

If you ever mistakenly respond to an email whose origins you are unsure of, and provide your personal information again you should immediately contact that organisation and have your passwords changed.

The internet is becoming a more popular method of doing business and will continue to do so. Business such as online banking and purchases can be conducted safely if some basic rules are followed. The main ones being NEVER give your user name and password to ANYBODY and NEVER respond to UNSOLICITED emails requesting such information.


It matters little what the monetary penalty is or how much education is given there are some drivers who just will not take notice of the road rules.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Driller's Tales, - Vietnam

After spending January to March (2006) in Chile and Peru checking out the performance of Ingetrol's Explorer Plus MD man-portable diamond core drill at elevations over 4,000 metres, I gave my recommendations to Triple Plate Junction Ltd (of London). Consequently they ordered two units (plus the ancillary downhole tools), for TPJ's projects in Vietnam and Zambia. Sonda Y Sur, the Peruvian drilling contractor for the Newmont Yanacocha mine (the largest gold mine in Peru) used these Explorer MD rigs exclusively for their exploration projects, and were keen readers of GeoDrilling, so they enjoyed meeting me in person after reading the Drillers Tales articles.

While they were being constructed and shipped across the Pacific, I went to the TPJ's Pu Sam Cap exploration area in Lai Chau province, 60 kilometres south of Yunnan, China, and 88 kms east from Laos, in north Vietnam. From the base of the PSC mountains to our field camp at 2,105 metres, it was a stiff three hour climb, and from there another 300 metres straight up to the drill sites.

TPJ had utilised the services of a Lao WestCoast Squirrel helicopter (out of Vientiane, Laos)) for their airborne magnetic survey, so I was able to grab one day to lift the 10 tonnes of drilling equipment, and myself, to the site. A seven minute trip. Normally, Lao WestCoast were fully engaged on U.S. MIA missions, as

were the Russian Mil 18s in Vietnam.

This was a quick project to drill some 250 metre + angle holes to test the prospect before the South American rigs arrived. For this, TPJ


employed the same local contractor, Drilling & Mining Technical Company of Hanoi (DMTC), which I had been using in Vietnam since 1997.

The drill used was an XY-2B Chinese made (Russian clone) rack-back rig, weighing 1.2 tonnes, and easily broken down for the 600 kg long line heli lifts.

A conventional drilling operation using a 1.5 metre core barrel and a T286 bit (core size 72 mm) followed by Ø50 mm Russian rods. With only 0.50 m of overburden, the holes were drilled all the way using this one size, with an overall core recovery of 98%. There was no water return.

To bring the diesel fuel to the drill sites we employed mountain ponies, who had strict load limitations, like the llama in Peru. Here they could carry two 20 litre jerry cans astride their pannier, and not a gram more, from the base of the mountain up to our field camp. From there to the drill site, a single Hmong porter could carry the two jerry cans in his back harness.

Environment funds

The Australian Government will spend \$2.25b between now and 2013 to help improve the environment and help further improve land management practices.

The programme, known as "Caring for our Country" programme will deliver funds to communities through a single entity that covers several funding streams, including the National Heritage Trust and National Landcare.

Equine Influenza

I am encouraged by revelations that surveillance of the horse industry has not found any new cases of Equine Influenza in Australia. This is important news for those locally who are involved with horse industries.

The Consultative Committee on Emergency Animal Diseases last week announced that Queensland could reclassify its last remaining Amber zone down to a Green zone, with the Federal Government advising that horses are again free to move within their states as well as interstate.

The EI outbreak has been a challenging and disheartening time for Australian horse owners to say the least, but the cooperation of owners to the many restrictions they have been subjected to over the past seven months has enabled positive progress in the campaign against the disease.

To receive international status as an EI-free nation, there remains a requirement for the authorities to maintain observation of the industry until later this year to ensure no new cases.
