Maleny Historical Village Open Day

The Maleny Historical Village will be holding an open day at Priscilla Cottage on October 28th. Come along and learn a little about Maleny's History.

This is magpie breeding time and they are at their defensive best

Ask anyone who has been unfortunate enough to be attacked by a magpie and they will tell you that it is no fun.

To the magpie it is no fun either. They are just protecting their home and family - just like you and I would do. Magpies breed from July to December with a peak in August-October.

We have a large number of magpies around out home and they have become very friendly

and they are happy to have us look at their family, but a few people panic and as a result their behaviour upset the magpies and as a result the magpies "swoop" at potential threats. They can be very aggressive and do a person some harm, but here are a few tips from the Department of Parks and Wildlife to get us through this season .

* Never deliberately provoke or harass a magpie. Throwing sticks

or stones at magpies usually makes a magpie more defensive.

* Avoid areas where magpies are known to swoop. (Remember, magpie aggression lasts only a few weeks and magpies usually only defend a small area of about 100m in radius around their nest.)

* Find the bird and keep watching it when entering a magpie territory. If swooped on, don't crouch in fear or stop. Move on quickly but

don't run.

* Bike riders — dismount and walk through nesting magpie territory, wear a helmet, and fit an orange traffic flag.

* Wear a hat or carry an umbrella to protect yourself. A magpie will attack initially from behind. When a magpie is tricked into believing the target is alert, an attack is stopped or not even started.

* Learning to live with magpies can be rewarding.

Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

PREVENTING AND RESOLVING PAINT COVERAGE PROBLEMS

Coverage of a paint film can be affected by several factors, including surface, application and color. Textured or porous surfaces usually require more paint to achieve a solid, uniform appearance. Darker colors can be more problematic at times and can require more than one coat of paint.

PREVENTING COVERAGE PROBLEMS

Primer

All bare surfaces should be primed with an appropriate primer following all label instructions. Primers are necessary to level the surface porosity in order to create a uniform finish.

Coverage

Most acrylic paint products are formulated to cover from 12 - 14 square mts per ltr depending on surface porosity. "Stretching" the paint, or applying material too sparsely, results in a thin paint film, which can also contribute to inadequate coverage.

Always be sure to follow label instructions for specific coverage rates.

Applicators

Premium applicators are always recommended when painting. Lower quality tools can contribute to problems with film coverage and de-

livery to the substrate. The correct roller nap length will provide an adequate paint film that will cover and hide the surface.

Color

Certain colors such as reds and yellows may require additional coats, and in some cases the use of a specialty color primer may be needed. See label instructions on appropriate primer.

RESOLVING COVERAGE PROBLEMS

Most coverage and hiding problems can be corrected by the application of an additional coat of paint. In addition, allowing adequate drying time will help to increase the opacity and provide favorable results.

BOB DENT MEMORIAL DAY RALLY IN THE PARK

The Northern Territory's Rights of the Terminally Ill Act, initiated by Marshall Perron, Chief Minister of the Northern Territory Government at that time came into operation of 1 July 1, 1996. Bob Dent became the first person to die legally with medical assistance by voluntary euthanasia. Following this a private members bill introduced by Kevin Andrews to overturn the NT act was passed in the Senate of March 15, 1997.

Bob Dent, a 66 year old Darwin man, who had suffered from prostate cancer for 5 years, became the first person to die using the Rights of the Terminally Ill Act, the first law in the world that legalised voluntary euthanasia.

Bob Dent's terminal illness had caused him severe pain and suffering. Bob, after due consideration, pressed a button indicating a decision to end his own life, and went to sleep within 30 seconds and died within 10 minutes.

On the day before he died Bob Dent said "What right has anyone to demand that I behave according

to their rules until some omniscient doctor decides that I must have had enough and goes ahead and increases my morphine until I die? If you don't agree with voluntary euthanasia then don't use it, but don't deny me the right to use it if and when I want to."

It is now 11 years since Northern Territorians had a choice of end-of-life decisions before the Federal government took away their right to choose.

On September 22nd at 10.50am members of the public will gather in front of Fiona Simpson MP's office and march to Cottontree Park, Maroochydore to commemorate his passing and the fact that this fiercely independent man could control his death himself.

His widow, Judy will be present, together with David Mills, husband of Janet Mills the second person to use the act. Dr Philip Nitschke and Marshall Perron will also speak at this meeting and Elaine Arch-Rowe, the author of "I bequeath the Python" will also be present.

Mum's favourite Recipes

Belgian Lemon Teacake

- Too sweet for me but some like it!

Cake: * 1 cup Self Raising Flour * 1/2 cup castor sugar * 1 egg * 60gm (2 oz) butter

Filling: * 1/4 cup of lemon juice * 1/2 cup sugar * 60gm butter (chopped) * 1 egg

Directions: Preheat oven to 180C. Brush shallow round tin with oil or butter. Sift flour, add sugar, mix well. Rub margarine and flour together with fingers until it looks like fine breadcrumbs. Make a well in the centre, stir in egg to make a soft dough. Press 2/3 dough into tin. Heat filling until viscous, pour hot filling into tin. Crumble remaining pastry over filling. Bake 30 minutes and cool in tin. Serve with cream.

Can substitute orange or pineapple juice, but lemon is best.
