Two men hurt in Macadamia Drive incident

Maleny Police are investigating an incident which occurred on Macadamia Drive, Maleny at about 7.30p.m. on Tuesday July 19th. Two men are in a serious condition in hospital following the incident.

One man had skull fractures and was transported to Nambour General Hospital and remains in a serious but stable condition. The second man suffered multiple lacerations and was taken to Maleny Hospital for treatment.

Emergency services were called to Macadamia Street Maleny about 7.40pm. to an incident which is being treated as a "hit and run" accident.

It has been suggested that the two male persons were known to each other and had been drinking at the Maleny hotel. It is also alleged that they had become involved in a dispute before leaving the hotel.

There are Maleny people out there who do know what happened and they have a responsibility to report what they know to the police.

Mum's favourite Recipes



Beef and Mushroom casserole

- always a great easy Sunday night meal!

Ingredients

- * 500g lean braising steak
- * 1 medium onion
- * 3 carrots, peeled and cut into large chunks
- * 1 tbsp plain flour
- * 2 bay leaves
- * Black pepper
- * 1 tsp dried thyme (or 2 tsp fresh thyme leaves, chopped finely)
- * 400ml water (or 200ml red wine and 200ml water)
- * 150g baby mushrooms, wiped

Method

Preheat the oven to 160 degrees C.

Cut the beef into large cubes, trimming off any fat. Place the flour, thyme and black pepper in a large plastic bag. Drop the beef into the bag and shake the bag to coat the meat with the seasoned flour.

Slice the onion finely lengthwise and place in a large casserole dish, together with the seasoned meat.

Pour over the water (or wine and water mixture).

Tuck in the bay leaves. Cover and cook for 1 hour and 15 minutes.

Take out of the oven and add the mushrooms, then return to the oven for another 30-40 minutes, or until the beef is really tender.

Serve with mashed or jacket potatoes and steamed green vegetables.

Volunteer RFB Training

Within the RFS there are both operational and support roles. Training within the Rural Fire Service is guided by the Volunteer Learning and Development Framework (VLDF), which you can download below.

Firefighting is a hazardous job and there are many risks involved in protecting your community against fire. The Volunteer Learning and Development Framework links training to volunteer roles.

By aligning courses to Rural Fire Service roles, volunteers have the opportunity to develop and maintain the specific knowledge and skills necessary to perform their role within the brigade. Training offered through the RFS is both accredited training (nationally recognised) and non-accredited training (recognised only within QFRS).

While the initial focus for volunteer training is on preparing volunteers for the in specific role in the brigade, we also ensure you can undertake a range of training that will assist you in your everyday life.

Browne le Brun

The Irish Brownes have made their mark in history since they came with the Normans in the 12th century, when they were known as le Brun. They settled in Galway, married into the leading families and joined the '14 Tribes of Galway'. A Browne from England was granted a huge area of Kerry by Elizabeth I. Ross castle by the Lakes of Killarney was Browne property. Lord Castlerosse, journalist an bon viveur, was the last of the Brownes to live in Kerry. Brownes spread throughout Ireland and went abroad in great numbers following the ill-fated Stuart monarchy. A soldier of fortune from Co. Limerick served in Russia where he rose to become Count George Browne at the court of Catherine the Great.

I was pleased to announce grants totalling \$4867 for the recognition of ex-servicemen and women in the Electorate of Fisher.

The grants go toward projects that aim to recognise the efforts of the men and women of our defence forces and help promote an appreciation and understanding of their roles in helping to shape this nation.

The funds are allocated to: Kawana Waters RSL Sub-branch - \$3000 for the installation of a secure cabinet in the Kawana sub branch office and Seasons Living aged care (Caloundra) - \$1867 to erect a memorial at the Season Caloundra aged care facility to commemorate all servicemen and women.
