Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place

Is there a trick to painting your old kitchen cupboard doors or bathroom vanity unit doors

Just follow these steps and use the correct products, its almost foolproof.

Use White Knight Tile or Laminate paint (and Primer) for superior results.

Firstly you should select the colour you want to use on your project, then calculate how much paint you will need (measure the doors width and height, multiply the two measurements together, do this with all your doors and total up, this will tell you how many square metres (or square feet) you need to paint.

This is how much Primer you need. Most Paints will cover 14 to 16 square metres per litre; Multiply this by two (for two coats) this is how much Tile/Laminate Paint you will need.

You MUST use the Primer or undercoat recommended for the "Tile/Laminate Paint". Get the Paint tinted to your colour choice.

I would suggest you also buy a good quality 75mm (3-inch) brush, a bottle of Turpentine, plus some fine sandpaper.

Ideally, the best method is to remove the doors from the cupboard, remove the hinges and handles, and then thoroughly wash the doors. Use Sugar soap for the first wash, then diluted bleach for the second wash. Pay particular attention to the area around where the handles fit. When dry, lightly sand the doors with fine grade sandpaper.

I cannot stress this point enough - Preparation is the

key to doing the job correctly.

Wash the doors thoroughly! Sand the doors carefully and diligently.

If the doors are not prepared properly, the paint will not stick.

How to paint old cupboard doors? You can use a Roller to paint the face of the doors but unless you have experience with a roller stick to using a brush.

If you lay the doors on two pieces of timber with some newspaper underneath to catch any drops this will let you paint the edges and one face. Make sure when painting the edges, that you do not overload the brush with paint. Too much paint will spread to the inside of the door.

Starting with the edges, apply the Primer using firm even strokes; do not overload the brush with paint. A thin coat is best. Take your time, and then prime the face of the door using firm even strokes. Start at the top left side of the door and paint across and down until finished.

Imagine you are painting a series of crosses on the door; just keep painting crosses until the door is finished. When dry turn over and Prime coat the inside of the door.

When dry follow the same procedure with the Tile/Laminate Paint. Do the edges first, then the face, then the inside last. Remember that you must allow drying time between coats.

Water Tanks

Have you ever symptoms such as nausea, headache, backache, and muscle aches. Do you often feel tired to the point that you are unable to carry out minor activities, or even get out of bed.

If so, there is a good chance that you have Ross River fever which is caused by a viral infection, transmitted through mosquito bites. Ross River virus infection cannot be passed from person to person.

Infection with the Ross River virus is most commonly associated with fever, rash and joint pains. Swelling of joints may also occur - especially in the fingers, wrists and feet - and joint stiffness tends to be worse in the morning.

The increasing number of backyard tanks carries the potential to spread dengue fever, Ross River Fever and could make Australia vulnerable to exotic foreign viruses.

Residential water tanks are helping to save us water but they need to be maintained properly.

If tanks are not maintained then you can end up with the screen actually deteriorating and developing holes, then mosquitoes can get in and breed.

How do you maintain a tank, you may ask? It merely amounts to ensuring that the openings have a gauze covering in good order and there is no uncovered water around or leaking.

An insight into Maleny History

The Peter Erdman Collection

The Maleny Film Society recently sponsored talks about archiving an important video collection for Maleny.

Peter Erdman, a well recognised local started filming occasions and events in Maleny in 1975 and he now has a catalogue of about 500 video tapes containing those events and occasions. These recordings are a reflection of the activities and a window into the life and times, and stories of Maleny's recent history.

Peter is concerned that the tapes may deteriorate and he would like to see this video history of Maleny be retained for future generations.

The tapes have been trusted to the Malent Community Credit Union for storage and subsequent use by the Maleny community.

Advice was sought from the Federal Government's National Film and Sound Archive Unit in Canberra about the best way to store

and catalogue this collection and as a result on Friday November 16th and Saturday 17th a community forum was held to find a way forward.

It would not be unusual to find that many local Maleny people have over the years collected video, film and photos of important events in Maleny's past and history. This is a good opportunity to ensure that the "memories of Maleny" are retained for future generations and that the history of Maleny is not rewritten or forgotten.
