The former employee, who does not want to be identified said that the organisation was too top management heavy. It is estimated that the Zoo needs about \$1 million a month to survive and patronage has been falling of recent times.

He continued that the Zoo has not really got over the way that it handled the split with Bob Irwin and this had cost it a lot "friends.

It is believed that following the death of Steve Irwin in an accident on the Barier reef in September 2006 much of the mystique of the Zoo disappeared.


Some visitors spoken to at the Zoo said that they were glad that they came because it is a great place to visit, but with ticket prices for an adult being so expensive at \$58 it did not encourage return visits.

Australia Zoo administration conducts a lot of business locally and this would impact further on some Beerwah businesses.

Inquiries of Australia Zoo elicited the comment that "like many local businesses the Zoo was facing "challenging" times, but it would survive despite not only the tough economic times, but the continued poor weather conditions of late."

The spokesperson continued, "Steve had a dream to take the Australia Zoo concept to Las Vegas and the Zoo administration is determined to continue on with that dream.

This art prize has achieved national acclaim for its annual representation of contemporary Australian art. It also assists to provide encourage artistic excellence and to bring quality artwork to a regional audience.

This is the sixth year of the Sunshine Coast Arts Prize and local Councillor, Jenny McKay said "The Sunshine Coast Art Prize is one of the richest acquisition art prizes in Australia."

All the material, including 30 cubic metres of river sand, and labour has been provided by the Club and its members. Gary West supplied the tifdwarf as scarifyings from his own green. Gary supervised its growth with a team of volunteers. The exercise has provided good practice for establishment and management of the greens for the first nine holes.

Ball washing goes hi-tech. Dennis Hickley had a brainwave. He tested his theory with a modified cement mixer to improve washing golf balls havested each week on the driving range.

Rod Waldron then provided the cement mixer with the fins covered in

soft material to minimise wear on the balls.

Two to three minutes is sufficient to put a shine on 300+ balls. No longer will volunteers need to hand scrub each ball.

Mum's favourite Recipes Beef Burgers easy Sunday night meal.

Ingredients

1kg minced beef - 1 small onion, chopped finely - 2 cloves garlic, chopped - 2 tblsp barbecue sauce - 2 tblsp Worcestershire sauce - 2 tblsp fresh parsely, chopped - 1/2 cup breadcrumbs - 1 egg, lightly beaten - 1 large onions, sliced - 6 slices cheese - 2 tomatoes, sliced - 6 bread rolls - 1/2 lettuce.

Method

Put beef, small chopped onion, garlic, sauces, parsley, breadcrumbs and egg into large bowl and Mix until combined. Shape mixture into 6 burger patties. Cook burger patties on barbecue until browned on both sides, cook large sliced onion as well. Add sliced cheese to the top of burgers for 2 minutes or until melted.

Split and toast rolls, then add lettuce and tomato, burger patties with cheese and onion.

Is a disaster levy all doom and gloom?

The Federal Government has introduced legislation to assist with repayments for work carried out in respect to recent extreme weather conditions throughout Australia.

Whilst there is opposition to the introduction of this legislation perhaps another thought should be given to the matter.

Instead of people going through the circumstance of not knowing if they are covered by insurance, services being disrupted and major infastructure projects delayed because of lack of money perhaps a disaster levy being imposed could have more benefits than first appears to be the case.

Why not have a permanent disaster levy attached to the medicare levy and the money raised being placed into a specific fund.

In addition to funds raised the federal government should also add a similar amount to suplement the fund.

The government's money should come not directly from general revenue, but from efficiency savings in bureaucracy. In other words cut some of the waste in government spending.

The levy should be levied, not only on the individual, but on pre-taxed profits above certain levels of companies.

Because insurance companies will continue to understate their duties when claims are made then stamp duty on policies should also be added to this fund.

This does not exempt individuals from needing to insure their property as insurance testing conditions would be invoked for property replacement, but hardship and immediate needs should be covered.

What it does do is give some surety of coverage to people who thought that they had done everything that they should to ensure coverage of property.

Properties on our coastlines are going to continue to increasingly be exposed to extreme weather. Governments need to take action now to ensure that when developement takes place then adequate precautions are taken in that development to ensure that infastructure is protected from foreseen eventualities.

Over years this amount of money would grow and communities would be able not only to rebuild, but to build the infastructure that would withstand future disasters.

Extreme weather is only going to continue to become more extreme.

Sealit for fixing a leaking fish pond. Maleny Paint Place

Is your fish tank or water trough leaking water. It may not be as hard to stop the leak as you think useing Shalex Sealit Multipurpose.

DIRECTIONS

Bruce Highway

The further widening of the Bruce Highway north of Caboolture to three lanes each way is a project that I have raised with the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport several times in the past, again last month and again more recently after the Government announced funding cuts of \$86 million to planned road works between Caboolture and Caloundra, to help pay for flood damage.

I also spoke in the Australian Parliament on the issue recently, where I noted that while securing funds for repairs of flood damage is important, it was also vital that the major road from Brisbane north was not neglected and was

as effective, efficient and safe as it could be.

This is becoming more important by the day as the Sunshine Coast population continues to grow and the number of people who commute to work in Brisbane also increases.

In my speech and in a letter to the minister, I advised that the highway was vital for commuters, truckies, tourists and retirees and therefore vital to our economy.
