Reesville Road turnoff to get a major re-build

A section of Kenilworth Road between Kings Lane and Lawrence Place is to be upgraded at a cost of approximately 2 million dollars. This section of road is situated on the witta side of the Kenilworth Road i/s Reesville Road.

Work is to commence before the end of June 2009. Work will see the road surface considerably widened and design changes to the Reesville Road intersection ensuring a much safer area.

This is the first of a number of projects on Kenilworth Road. Depending on the weather, this project is expected to be finalised before Christmas 2009.

Further studies by the Transport Department will highlight other areas of Kenilworth Road between Conondale and Cambrook that need to be upgraded. Funding for this study has been allocated and that study will commence immediately.

Work has also recently commenced at Fritz Creek to replace the bridge and upgrade the approaches. This project is also expected to be finalised by the end of 2009.

Kenilworth Road has continued to carry an increased traffic flow of recent years and that traffic flow will continue to grow, especially as this route has become a major tourist route.

Taxation Department advises of a fraudulent email doing the rounds

With the end of the financial year approaching, the Australian Tax Office is warning of a fraudulent email that is doing the rounds.

The email wrongly offers taxpayers a 30% reduction in their tax owing and invites people to visit a website and enter their tax file number. The ATO advises that it never sends emails to people asking them to provide private information,

including their tax file number.

It is strongly advised that anyone who receives this email or similar emails should delete them immediately to avoid potentially falling into trouble with identity theft.

Anyone who has entered their tax file number or personal information on the website should contact the Australian Tax Office immediately on 13 28 61.


MDSRC Receives Funding for Precinct Business Plan

Member for Glasshouse Andrew Powell was advised this week by the Minister for Tourism and Fair Trade that the M.D.S.R.C. Inc had been successful in obtaining funding from the Gambling Community Development Fund to produce a Precinct Business Plan.

Mr Powell said, "I'd like to take this opportunity to congratulate M.D.S.R.C. on the attainment of funding towards the formation of a strategic plan. Given the financial restraints community organisations have to work around, it is heartening to see fiscal relief offered in the form of this well-deserved grant for \$4,180."

The M.D.S.R.C. Inc has employed the CPR Group (project facilitators and consultation specialists for sport and recreational development to assist in the formulation of a business plan for sport and recreational areas 7 and 7a on the Precinct.

The CPR Group has been working with not-for-profit organisations and local Councils on strategic planning projects since 1977. In that time securing in excess of \$10 million in funding and working with 1,000 organisations.

M.D.S.R.C. Inc represents 30 Maleny sport and recreational club affiliates. President Mike Norman said "This is very good news; as the Council now moves towards the formation of the master plan for the Precinct, it is vital for a successful outcome for the community of Maleny that M.D.S.R.C. presents them with a detailed business and strategic plan. We have been working closely with the professional services of the CPR Group for nearly a year now and an integral part of the process has been to ensure we work in consultation with all user groups on the Precinct." He continued, "The funds just obtained will be used by the CPR Group to prepare our strategic development plan, involving consultation and liaison with M.D.S.R.C. management, the relevant stakeholders and the Sunshine Coast Regional Council. Part of the process will be the organising and facilitating of planning workshops by CPR, leading ultimately to a draft business plan."

Mum's favourite Recipes

Sesame Chicken Kababs

- easy evening meal on these warm afternoons.

Ingredients

- * 1 750gm topside steak
- * 2oz butter
- * 1 large onion
- * 6 cloves garlic
- * 1 inch piece of green ginger
- * 1 tablespoon coriander
- * 2 teaspoons cumin
- * 1 teaspoon turmeric
- * 1 teaspoon poppy seeds
- * 1 teaspoon mustard powder
- * 1 teaspoon dried crushed chillies
- * 1 cup water with 1 beef cube (broth)
- * 1 teaspoon chilli powder

Method

Slice onion and garlic, mince the ginger, cut steak into small squares, heat butter and fry meat with the onion, garlic and ginger. Lower heat and add spices, chillies and beef broth, cover and simmer on very low heat for 2 hours, add 1/2 teaspoon salt.

To serve with curry

Boiled rice, pappadams, mango chutney, sliced banana, tossed in coconut, diced cucumber in yoghurt, sprinkled with paprika, tomato and onion slices with vinaigrette dressing, raisins, nuts.

Another paint hint from Maleny Paint Place **Panel Painting**

It looked good at the time but it is time for a change!

Painting over panelling is not as difficult as you may think. The secret is to use a great primer and good technique. Finish paints will not stick to most panelling surfaces without the aid of adhesion-promoting primer. The right primer bonds to the smooth, shiny surface, forming a sound base for the topcoat.

Zinsser makes an adhesion-promoting primer called B-I-N® Primer-Sealer that's ideal for preparing panelling for painting. B-I-N is unique because it's a shellac-based product. It will seal porous surfaces like new wood and seal off knots and sappy streaks in knotty pine so they don't bleed through and ruin the paint job.

B-I-N is white-pigmented to block out dark stains and colours, and it dries to a smooth, full, even film that makes the topcoat look great. It dries rapidly, ready for top coating in just an hour, and it cures fully in just a few hours, providing a tough abrasion-resistant film.

* If surface contamination is excessive, a second mineral spirits wash may be required (rinse rag between applications)

* To be sure you have removed all traces of surface contamination and paint thinner residue,

wash the surface with a mixture of household ammonia and water.

* Allow the clean surface to dry for approximately 30 minutes.

The next step is; - Prime the Paneling.

Apply one coat of B-I-N Primer-Sealer with a roller, brush, pad or sprayer, and let dry for an hour. If high humidity conditions exist, allow longer to make sure the primer has dried thoroughly before applying a topcoat).

The next step is simply apply the Topcoat to Panelling. One or two coats of a top-quality finish paint.

(Tip: You can have the primer tinted to the colour that matches the colour of the topcoat, which can help reduce the number of coats needed to complete the job. The primer tint may not be the exact top coat colour depending on the base of the top coat but it is still worth tinting the primer.)

Vehicle Stability

From November 2011, newly approved passenger cars, vans and four-wheel drives must require Electronic Stability Control (ESC) as standard.

Electronic Stability Control works by continuously monitoring speed, steering wheel angle, the direction of travel and acceleration on corners, and if the system detects potential danger it automatically applies individual brakes to correct any deviation from the desired direction of travel.

Research in Australia and other nations has found the technology to have potentially a significant potential to save lives.

Aged Care

A new report, titled "Residential Aged Care in Australia 2007-08: a statistical overview" has been released by the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW).

The report found that as at 2008, Australia had 175,472 residential aged care places in operation; that there were 105,030 admissions to residential aged care facilities from July 2007 to June 2008 - 53,737 of them for permanent care; the time people are spending in residential aged care is increasing, from 131.3 weeks in 1998-99 to 147.8 weeks in 2007/08.
