Work starts on Pattemore House upgrade!

Friends of Pattemore House President Su Carbery is pleased to report that repairs have commenced at Pattemore House, Maleny's heritage listed property, now owned by Sunshine Coast Council.

Built in 1907 from white beech felled and pit-sawn on the property, the house, which sits at the entrance to the Maleny Community Precinct, is undergoing some nec-

Mum's favourite Recipes

Seafood Rice Salad

- This is a great tasting easy dinner meal

Ingredients

- * 1 kg of seafood marinara mix
- * 1 onion, chopped
- * 2 cups of rice
- * 4 cloves of garlic, chopped finely
- * 1 red capsicum, chopped
- * frozen peas - about 3/4 cup
- * 1 litre of stock
- * a dash of turmeric
- * 2 fresh tomatoes, chopped or 1 can of diced tomatoes
- * chopped parsley

Directions

Heat the oil in the fry pan, add onion, garlic and capsicum and cook for 2 minutes before adding the rice.

Mix and add stock and tomatoes. Bring to the boil and add the turmeric. Simmer uncovered for 15 minutes.

Then add the seafood mix and the peas, stir and cover the pan. Cook until the rice has absorbed the stock. Sprinkle with parsley and serve.

completed, the Friends will utilise a small area of the building to continue and present their research into the timber, dairy and modern history of the property ("Fairview") and surrounding Precinct land.

The original 1907 sections of the house will be preserved to enable future visitors to appreciate the pit-sawn and hand-planed timbers used in the floors and walls, whilst learning more about the history of Maleny, its industries, and its pioneering families and their place within the history of the Sunshine Coast and South-East Queensland.

The group (originally set up by Caloundra Council to

assist in the future management of Pattermore House) is engaged in the promotion of the 2.4 hectare Pattermore House site as a heritage property, and to develop its future use as a heritage interpretative and cultural community asset, in partnership with Sunshine Coast Council. "There is so much potential here for young people to learn about our past", says Su.

For the last three years, the Friends have been busily researching and cataloguing the family, house and landscape history and collecting images, maps and stories associated with Pattermore House, the families who lived there and the surrounding landscape.

Members also maintain the garden and grounds, and plan to restore the house garden in partnership with the Maleny Garden Club after an analysis of the garden's history has been completed.

Further exciting news is that a heritage trail beginning at the house and meandering across to the old dairy bails and then down to historic Reynold's Crossing is to commence in June. This will be the first of the walking trails to be constructed from the network of trails planned on the Precinct by SCC; any enquiries about the Friends of Pattermore House to mihongasu@bigpond.com

Harvey's 100 years of Maleny Life at Pattemore House!

As told by Val Carbery to her daughter, Susan.

I remember almost every Sunday we would go to "Fairview" for lunch. We would be dressed in our nice dresses, and Mum would warn us to be on our best behaviour, as great-grandfather could get a bit cranky with noisy little girls at the lunch table.

He believed they should be seen and not heard.

We'd arrive in plenty of time for Mum to help her aunts prepare the meal. My great-grandmother Emily had passed away when I was only one, but had long suffered from rheumatic fever.

As a result of her illness one of my widowed great-aunts had always lived there.

Mum had lived there too for most of her life before she married Dad, helping on the farm and around the house.

Lunch was often a traditional hot meal of meat and vegetables – sometimes roast,

sometimes corned beef. It was served on the big kitchen table, with great-grandfather seated at the head. I remember his big bushy beard and his walking stick, and his very serious manner.

Over the next couple of months we will be bringing some stories as told by Harvey Bryce from Maleny's past.

Harvey is well versed in Maleny's past and is heavily involved in the Maleny Historic Society.

The six of us would be seated on a long bench along the wall – with either Mavis or myself nursing baby Judith, whilst Mum helped dish up the meal.

We all had to sit up straight, hands in our laps and wait, wait until great-grandfather started to eat. Mum

had prepped us well with stories of when she was a little girl, getting her knuckles rapped with his walking stick if she dared to start eating before he did, and none of us were prepared to test the validity of this.

After lunch we would go out on the front verandah and play – knuckles (made from real pig knuckles), or pick-up-sticks.

Here we were expected to act like young ladies. But we always left early as we had a working dairy, and with no brothers it was left up to us girls to help Dad bring in the cows and milk them.

O Dalaigh

The Irish name is O Dalaigh, which was the word for a meeting place. The O Dalaigh ancestry goes back to the 4th century, to Niall of the Nine Hostages, the High King who had his palace at Tara, co. Meath, and from whom descended also the O Neills and the O Donnells. They are very prominent in records dating from the 12th to the 18th century, when their extraordinary genius for bardic literature was manifest in the bardic school set up by Cuconnocht O Dalaigh in Westmeath. Their outstanding churchman was a Dominican friar, Daniel, who, fleeing religious persecution went to Europe where he founded colleges in Louvain and Lisbon.

Sunshine Coast Council to provide more park and recreation areas

There are more than 780 hectares of recreational parks throughout the Sunshine Coast Regional Council region.

These parcels of land form part of the region's open space network, catering for informal recreational, social, cultural and leisure activities for the community.

At a special budget meeting recently Sunshine Coast Council endorsed a 10-year \$62 million capital works program.

The program will guide the renewal of existing assets and the construction of new assets within recreational parks over the next decade.

Council has committed to spend in the 2011/12 financial year in excess of \$9.4 million on the replacement and upgrade of recreational parks.

These areas are provided to providing quality spaces that encourage active and healthy communities within this council's region.

For some time Sunshine Coast Regional Council libraries have been running free classes on breeding worm farms.

Anyone who has been to one of these compost and wormfarm workshops knows how great they are, but some people just don't have the time to attend.

To help those people out the Sunshine Coast Council is bringing the popular workshop to gardeners at home in the form of a DVD called 'Compost Worm Farms and Everything in Between'.

The DVD is freely available from council libraries, including mobile units, customer contact centres, council offices and online at www.sunshinecoast.qld.gov.au and is an interesting watch for anyone even remotely interested in gardening, free fertiliser and sustainable waste management.

The DVD includes information on setting up, maintaining and troubleshooting an organic recycling system.

The compost and wormfarm initiative was developed as part of the Sunshine Coast Waste Minimisation Strategy, which identified diverting food and garden waste from landfill as one of the most important things to be done to reduce our impacts on climate change.

Mary Cairncross Park gets a parking upgrade

For years now Mary Cairncross Park has been a favourite place to visit for visitors to the Maleny area.

Mary Cairncross Scenic Reserve comprises 55 hectares of National Estate listed subtropical rainforest overlooking the Glasshouse Mountains.

Work has now started on an upgrade to the facilities at the park.

The MaryCSR Buildings Development Stakeholder Group have been working with the Sunshine Coast Regional Council to draw up plans for infrastructure development at Mary Cairncross Reserve.

The working plans agreed on required that the new infrastructure should fit within existing footprint of 2700sq m, with no loss of recreational or forest reserve.

The work should comply with the Thynne sisters' original intent for the Reserve when it was donated to the community.

The upgrade will include;

1. A Council and Volunteers office complex with an area of 82 sq m.
2. Staff and volunteer parking and deliveries (60 sq m) – Public car park. Construction is presently underway.

3. Kiosk upgrade of the existing footprint, capacity 80 seated – approx. An elevated 1 metre high timber deck enhancing views, in current outdoor seating area, with ramps and steps.

4. A Meeting / Conference Room of approx. 80 sq m). It will include a meeting and conference room for 50 people

5. Education Centre upgrades – Four meeting/conference rooms would dramatically reduce pressure on the Education Centre.

The concept of the upgrade will be “bringing the outside in” and will be evident in the building design.

This will be achieved via floor to ceiling glass with natural construction materials including stone and timber. The design is to showcase best practice in sustainable building design and energy use.

The plan will also create connections between the buildings and the designed pathways and connections will be aesthetically pleasing to the area, but at the same time functional.

The finalised work will ensure that Mary Cairncross Park will remain a prime location for tourists who visit the Maleny area.
